Old Business

- 1)Rich was to send proposals to the County for flood mitigation funding. Have any been sent. Reply only for the Road to Nowhere shortening. Have asked for \$15/20K
- 2) Have the banks been re seeded and has the silt buildup been removed at Bub Walker Park? Replyneed another contractor to finish the work. Also the No. Barry extension and the Grove St underpass by 95 need to be re done constantly as they re silt quickly.

New Business

- 1) Dan was to distribute the VOM Comprehensive Plan Environmental Assessment form to all members of the FMAC. Has this happened. Reply-this will be done at once.
- 2) Update on All Hazard Mitigation Plan. Reply- 1st major step is HAZ NY plan which is in work. Potential hazards plan has been re done. Next step planning process, financial impact, identify mitigation strategies. Notice to procede was given April/May. Will take 12/18 months. At the BOT meeting immediately after the floods Rich advised it would take only 8 months to complete.
- 3) A discussion ensued about the pipe out of the Sheldrake Dam. It was discussed this pipe needs to be larger to evacuate more water sooner. Rich to discuss w/Steve Altieri
- 4) A discussion took place that the County is thinking of building detention basins at Maplemoor golf course. The VM and asst VM will follow up for further info.
- 5) Andrew Spatz suggested a member of the FMAC should be at the Village's Command Center during flood events to try to help coordinate the flow of information to and from neighborhood associations. Further discussion was had that we as a committee should try to put information together for our web site of the steps flood victims need to take in case of flood events. Rich mentioned there may be pumps avail for post disaster use. We also discussed putting a list of approved contractors for people to contact post disaster.
