DECISION ON A SPECIAL PERMIT CITY COUNCIL ORDER NO. 17-1006816E

The City Council of the City of Marlborough hereby GRANTS the Application for a Special Permit to BSL Marlborough Development LLC (the "Applicant") to build and operate an assisted living facility with a special care unit at 421 Bolton Street, Marlborough, Massachusetts, as provided in this Decision and subject to the following Procedural Findings and Findings of Facts and Conditions.

FINDINGS OF FACT AND RULING

- 1. The Applicant, BSL Marlborough Development LLC, is a duly organized and existing Limited Liability Company having a business address c/o Benchmark Senior Living, 201 Jones Road, Third Floor West, Waltham, Massachusetts 02451.
- 2. Richard and Jill Cochrane are the owners of the property located at 421 Bolton Street, Marlborough, Massachusetts, as shown on the Marlborough Assessors Maps as Map 30, Parcels 13 and 14, and the City of Marlborough is the owner of the property shown on the Marlborough Assessors Maps as Map 30, Parcel 700 (the "Site").
- 3. The Applicant proposes to build and operate a new 104-bed, 60,823+/- square foot assisted living facility with a special care unit at the Site (the "Use").

- 4. The Site is located in the Residence A-2 Zoning District, north of U.S. Route 20 and with frontage on Massachusetts State Route 85.
- 5. The Site has an area of approximately 677,332 square feet (15.5 acres).
- 6. The Applicant, by and through its counsel, filed with City Clerk of the City of Marlborough an Application for a Special Permit ("Application") for the Use, as provided in this Decision.
- 7. In connection with the Application, the Applicant has submitted a certified list of abutters, filing fees, and a detailed site plan entitled "Site Development Plans for Benchmark Senior Living" prepared by Bohler Engineering and dated January 20, 2017, revised March 28, 2017, May 31, 2017 and July 18, 2017 (the "Plans").
- 8. The Plans were certified by the Building Commissioner of the City of Marlborough, acting on behalf of the City Planner for the City of Marlborough, as having complied with Rule 4, items (a) through (m), of the Rules and Regulations promulgated by the City Council for the issuance of a Special Permit.
- 9. Pursuant to the Rules and Regulations of the City Council for the City of Marlborough and applicable statutes of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, the City Council established a date for public hearing on the Application and the City Clerk for the City of Marlborough caused notice of the same to advertised and determined that notice of the same was provided to abutters entitled thereto in accordance with applicable regulations and law.
- 10. The Marlborough City Council, pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 40A, held a public hearing on the Application on Monday, May 8, 2017. The hearing was opened and closed on that date. On June 19, 2017, the City Council approved an Agreement to Extend Time Limitations to extend the time for final action on the Application to September 12, 2017.
- 11. The Applicant, through its representatives, presented testimony at the public hearing detailing the Project, describing its impact upon municipal services, the neighborhood, and traffic.

BASED ON THE ABOVE, THE CITY COUNCIL MAKES THE FOLLOWING FINDINGS AND TAKES THE FOLLOWING ACTIONS

- A. The Applicant has complied with all Rules and Regulations promulgated by the Marlborough City Council as they pertain to special permit applications.
- B. The City Council finds that the proposed Use of the Site is an appropriate use and in harmony with the general purpose and intent of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Marlborough when subject to the appropriate terms and conditions as provided herein. The City Council makes these findings subject to the completion and adherence by the Applicant, its successors and/or assigns to the conditions more fully set forth herein.
- C. In accordance with Section 650-18(44)(c) of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Marlborough, the City Council also finds that:

- 1. There is adequate access to and from the proposed assisted living facility for emergency response vehicles, insofar as the Plans demonstrate sufficient space for emergency response vehicles to enter and exit the Site.
- 2. Alternative access to the Site is not necessary, based upon the sufficiency of the Site's primary access in the event of an emergency evacuation.
- 3. There are sufficient provisions for medical transport, based upon the Site's access ways and layout.
- 4. The overall impact of the proposed assisted living facility will not adversely affect the neighborhood or the City, as the Site is located in the vicinity of similar or complimentary land uses and the Use, as conditioned in this Decision, will have minimal impact on the neighborhood and the City.
- D. In accordance with Section 650-18(44).d.(1) and Section 650-59.C(12)(a) of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Marlborough, the City Council also finds that the Applicant has agreed to donate approximately 10 acres of the Site to the City for municipal purposes (the "Donated Land"). The Donated Land will benefit the City and its citizens generally, and prior to the separation of the Donated Land from the Site, the Use conformed to the dimensional criteria set forth in Section 650-41 of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Marlborough.
- E. The Donated Land includes a walking trail in the southeast corner as shown on Sheet 4 of the Plans. The walking trail connects the 1LT Charles W. Whitcomb School and the athletic fields on the Marlborough High School property, although the trail was disturbed as a result of the construction of the athletic fields. The Applicant has agreed to clear the vegetation for a path to make the connection from the base of the slope by the athletic field around the slope out to Stevens Street. Such work shall be complete before the issuance of a final Occupancy Permit for the Use. The precise location of the clearing to reconnect the path will be identified in the field by the Applicant and the City Conservation Officer.
- F. The City Council finds that the Plans comport with the design standards set forth in Section 650-18(44).d(3).
- G. The City Council, pursuant to its authority under Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 40A and the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Marlborough hereby GRANTS the Applicant a Special Permit to build and operate an assisted living facility with a special care unit as shown on the Plans filed, SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS, which conditions shall be binding on the Applicant, its successors and/or assigns:
 - 1. <u>Construction in Accordance with Applicable Laws</u>. Construction of all structures on the Site is to be in accordance with all applicable Building Codes and Zoning Regulations in effect in the City of Marlborough and the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, and shall be built according to the Plans as may be amended during Site Plan Review.

- 2. <u>Compliance with Applicable Laws</u>. The Applicant, its successors and/or assigns agrees to comply with all municipal, state, and federal rules, regulations, and ordinances as they may apply to the construction, maintenance, and operation of the Project.
- Site Plan Review. The issuance of the Special Permit is further subject 3. to detailed Site Plan Review in accordance with the City of Marlborough site plan review ordinance prior to the issuance of the building permit. Any additional changes, alterations, modifications or amendments, as required during the process of Site Plan Review, shall be further conditions attached to the building permit, and no occupancy permit shall complied Applicant has issued until the be conditions. Subsequent Site Plan Review shall be consistent with the conditions of this Special Permit and the Plans submitted, reviewed and approved by the City Council as the Special Permit Granting Authority.
- 4. Modification of Plans. Notwithstanding conditions #1 and #3 above, the City Council or the Site Plan Review Committee may make engineering changes to the Plans, so long as said changes do not change the use of the Project as approved herein, or materially increase the impervious area of the Project, reduce the green area, alter traffic flow, increase the size, shape or position of the building, or alter the fencing bordering the property, all as shown on the Plans.
- 5. <u>Incorporation of Submissions</u>. All plans, photo renderings, site evaluations, briefs and other documentation provided by the Applicant as part of the Application, and as amended or revised during the application/hearing process before the City Council and/or the City Council's Urban Affairs Committee, are herein incorporated into and become a part of this Special Permit and become conditions and requirements of the same, unless otherwise altered by the City Council.
- 6. Storm Water and Erosion Control Management. The Applicant, its successors and/or assigns shall ensure that its site superintendent during construction of the project is competent in stormwater and erosion control management. This individual(s) credentials shall be acceptable to the Engineering Division of the City's Department of Public Works and the City's Conservation Commission. This individual(s) shall be responsible for checking the Site before, during, and after storm events including weekends and evenings when storms are predicted. This individual(s) shall ensure that no untreated stormwater leaves the Site consistent with the State's and the City's stormwater regulations. This individual(s) shall ensure compliance with the approved sequence of construction plan and the approved erosion control plan. The Applicant, its successors and/or assigns shall grant this individual(s) complete authority of the Site as it relates to stormwater and erosion controls.

- 7. Parking. The Applicant shall provide 65 parking spaces at the Site, plus 10 additional overflow parking spaces, as shown on the Plans, which exceeds the parking required for the Use under Section 650-48.A(16) of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Marlborough by 15 spaces. Prior to the issuance of the final Occupancy Permit, the Applicant shall enter into a written agreement with a third party for the provision of any off-site parking needed for holidays and special events at the Site.
- 8. Donated Land: Lot Coverage. Pursuant to Finding D of this Decision and in accordance with Section 650-18(44)d(1) of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Marlborough, the Applicant shall donate the Donated Land to the City for municipal purposes, and following the conveyance of the Donated Land to the City, the maximum lot coverage allowed for the Use as shown on the Plans may exceed 30% notwithstanding the dimensional criteria set forth in Section 650-41 of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Marlborough. The Donated Land shall be deeded to the City at the time of the closing of the Applicant's acquisition of the Site, subject to the City's conveyance of the "Sewer Parcel" and "drainage easement" as referenced in condition 9 below.
- 9. Mitigation Payment. The Applicant has agreed to donate One Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000, the "Mitigation Payment") to the City to mitigate the impacts of the Use on the City. The Mitigation Payment shall be made to the City within 60 days of the issuance of the Building Permit for the Use. The Mitigation Payment will benefit the City and its citizens generally. The Mitigation Payment includes Fourteen Thousand Dollars (\$14,000) in compensation to be paid by the Applicant to the City pursuant to the Applicant's February 16, 2017 Request to Purchase or Have City-Owned Property Abandoned for 13,401 SF+/- Land Off of Bolton Street, Assessor's Map No. 30, Parcel No. 700 ("Sewer Parcel"), subject to the City Council's approval of the Applicant's Request by the City Council. The City would retain a permanent sewer easement in the Sewer Parcel. The \$14,000 valuation of the Sewer Parcel was established pursuant to a November 1, 2016 appraisal by Kenneth J. Croft III, Esq. of Foster Appraisal & Consulting Co., Inc. The Mitigation Payment also includes any compensation to be paid by the Applicant to the City for the acquisition of a drainage easement from the northern property line of the Site to the Proposed Connection to Existing Catch Basin on the property of the City of Marlborough (Marlborough Assessors Maps, Map 30, Lot 12) between the property line to the Site and Poirier Drive, as shown on Sheet 6 of the Plans, and subject to the City Engineer's review and the City Council's approval. The Mitigation Payment is intended to subsidize the City's construction of a concession stand and bathrooms for the athletic fields at the 1LT Charles W. Whitcomb School.

- 10. <u>Traffic Mitigation</u>. To mitigate any traffic-related concerns related to the proposed project, the Applicant has agreed to make the improvements specified in June 20, 2017 Memorandum of Jason Adams, P.E., PTOE of McMahon Transportation Engineers & Planners re "Vehicle Speed and Safety Assessment, Bolton Street (Route 85), Marlborough, Massachusetts;" and the June 25, 2017 Memorandum from Timothy F. Collins, Assistant City Engineer to the Traffic Commission re "Traffic Safety Plan in the Vicinity of #421 Bolton Street for Benchmark Senior Living," all as approved by the City's Traffic Commission on July 25, 2017. Such traffic-related improvements shall be complete before the issuance of the final Occupancy Permit for the Use.
- 11. The Applicant shall hold a job fair in the City for the purpose of giving Marlborough residents an opportunity to apply for employment at the assisted living facility. This condition may be satisfied by the Applicant's participation in a job fair organized by the Marlborough Economic Development Corporation.
- 12. Recording of Decision. In accordance with the provisions of M.G.L. c. 40A, § 11, Applicant, its successors and/or assigns at its expense shall record this Special Permit in the Middlesex South Registry of Deeds after the City Clerk has certified that the twenty-day period for appealing this Special Permit has elapsed with no appeal having been filed, and before the Applicant has applied to the Building Commissioner for a building permit. Upon recording, Applicant shall forthwith provide a copy of the recorded Special Permit to the City Council's office, the Building Department and the City Solicitor's office.



This is a matching grant, but as the enclosed notification of grant award form indicates, the match will be in the form of staff time. Although this is a regional effort, Marlborough is the lead municipality on this grant and will be responsible for administering the budget and providing oversight.

PART II: Project Narrative

Overview:

The vision of the Boroughs Loop Trail is to connect the hiking trail networks of Marlborough, Southborough, Westborough and Northborough collectively "the Boroughs", to create a regional trail that encourages the exploration, enjoyment, and protection of the four "boroughs" communities' natural resources. The Boroughs Loop Trail will showcase the natural beauty of the region; enhance ecological and economic health for the region; and promote a positive outdoor experience for all. A feasibility Study was completed in 2013 with the Marlborough Economic Development Corporation as the lead community. The desire at that time was to strengthen the trails and greenways system of the region making the Boroughs a more attractive and desirable location for employers, their employees and residents.

The trail as currently envisioned will be a 33+ mile trail connecting the existing trail systems in all four communities. Marlborough has taken the lead in coordinating the intracommunity trail concept, but all four communities and local land trusts (as listed below) are equal partners in this endeavor and excited about the prospect of a 33+ mile trail loop connection through our communities. 17.7 miles of this 33.3-mile loop is already constructed and being used as a trail. This grant proposal requests funds to connect the remaining 16 miles of trail by adding signage, constructing trails and building boardwalks, stairs and bog bridges as needed to make the loop continuous through all four communities.





The BayPath Board of Directors met on July 26, 2017 and voted on the funding of the Title III programs for the Federal Fiscal Year 2018. The Marlborough COA was awarded grant funding under Title III B for the amount of \$5,040.00 for the Marlborough Seniors on the GO...Driver Wanted I Program. As this amount is less than your grant application request, please submit a revision of the budget to reflect the difference, no later than August 25, 2017.

The reduction in the award amount is based, in part, on this is the 5th year of transportation funding with limited changes in programing. The application indicated that there are two part-time drivers each compensated an annual stipend of \$5040.00. It did not clearly explain the rationale for greater compensation of a 3rd driver. 

Our practice has been for the proposed extension agreement to be signed by the special permit applicant and placed on the Council agenda for a formal approval, which is generally if not always granted by unanimous vote.

This Council practice can sometimes run into challenges. For example, during the summer, the Council holds meetings only once during each of the months of July and August. During the winter months, the possibility exists that a blizzard or other weather conditions may result in the postponement of a Council meeting. These and other challenges can lead to difficulties for the Council, as a full body, to approve – in timely fashion – an extension agreement for any given special permit application.

Therefore, for purposes of the Council's administrative convenience, I am proposing an amendment to the City's zoning ordinance by which the Council would designate and authorize the person then serving in the position of its President or, in his or her absence or incapacity, in the position of its Vice-President, to sign a special permit extension agreement on behalf of the Council, without the necessity of a formal vote being taken at a regular Council meeting. The proposed amendment drafted by the Legal Department is attached for your review and deliberation.

Applicable State Law

Municipal Approval of the Construction and Placement of AT&T's Wires and Related Pole Attachments is governed by Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 166, Sections 21-22. As a FCC regulated provider of intrastate telecommunications services, AT&T is authorized under Chapter 166, Section 21 to construct lines and other facilities upon, along, under and across the public ways. Such construction must not incommode the public use of public ways.

In order to obtain municipal permission to construct its telecommunications facilities in public ways, AT&T must file a written petition with the selectmen of a town or the board of alderman or like body of a city, such as the AT&T City Council, pursuant to Chapter 166, Section 22. This same process has been employed routinely by the City of Marlborough in the case of Verizon and Massachusetts Electric Company, in the case of poles, wires, conduits and related appurtenances. In carrying out the permit-granting authority conferred by the General Court, municipalities act as public officers under a delegation of power from the General Court and not as agents of the municipality. Municipalities may adopt reasonable regulations for the erection of facilities by telecommunications carriers having authority to place their facilities in or under public ways. AT&T stands ready, willing and able to comply with the reasonable requirements of the City under General Laws Chapter 166, Sections 21-22 and related requirements imposed by the City applicable to grants of location by the City Council.

Project Description

AT&T proposes to deploy (4) small cell sites in the City of Marlborough in order to deal with ongoing demand on the wireless network. All (4) will be mounted on existing National Grid utility poles located within the public right of way. The small cell sites will work in conjunction with the existing macro sites installed on city rooftops, towers and other structures. This petition specifically addresses the following location:

AT&T's radio frequency engineers targeted the proposed location due to the high traffic nature and data demand on the network. The existing macro cell sites are having difficulty providing adequate data capacity in the location due to a number of reasons relating to increased population, vehicle and foot traffic, multiple devices per person and other contributing factors. The small cell site will work to offload the demand on the macro sites and allow for increased LTE data capacity and speed within the immediate vicinity of the proposed site.

The network will be installed using typical and commercially accepted methods. Currently no new poles are proposed to be installed. All other poles in this development are existing poles, and are owned and maintained by National Grid through a Pole Attachment Agreement.

Installed telecommunication facilities will include fiber optic cable and small remote nodes for transmitting RF signal, with an unobtrusive pole top antenna on utility poles. Specifically, a small antenna on top of each pole measuring 24.7" \times 10" along with an equipment cabinet mounted further down the pole. Attached please find design sketches at each site showing the proposed location, pole height, mounting height, equipment specifications and utility plan.

Applicable State Law

Municipal Approval of the Construction and Placement of AT&T's Wires and Related Pole Attachments is governed by Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 166, Sections 21-22. As a FCC regulated provider of intrastate telecommunications services, AT&T is authorized under Chapter 166, Section 21 to construct lines and other facilities upon, along, under and across the public ways. Such construction must not incommode the public use of public ways.

In order to obtain municipal permission to construct its telecommunications facilities in public ways, AT&T must file a written petition with the selectmen of a town or the board of alderman or like body of a city, such as the AT&T City Council, pursuant to Chapter 166, Section 22. This same process has been employed routinely by the City of Marlborough in the case of Verizon and Massachusetts Electric Company, in the case of poles, wires, conduits and related appurtenances. In carrying out the permit-granting authority conferred by the General Court, municipalities act as public officers under a delegation of power from the General Court and not as agents of the municipality. Municipalities may adopt reasonable regulations for the erection of facilities by telecommunications carriers having authority to place their facilities in or under public ways. AT&T stands ready, willing and able to comply with the reasonable requirements of the City under General Laws Chapter 166, Sections 21-22 and related requirements imposed by the City applicable to grants of location by the City Council.

Project Description

AT&T proposes to deploy (4) small cell sites in the City of Marlborough in order to deal with ongoing demand on the wireless network. All (4) will be mounted on existing National Grid utility poles located within the public right of way. The small cell site will work to offload the demand on the macro sites and allow for increased LTE data capacity and speed within the immediate vicinity of the proposed site.

The network will be installed using typical and commercially accepted methods. Currently no new poles are proposed to be installed. All other poles in this development are existing poles, and are owned and maintained by National Grid through a Pole Attachment Agreement.



Traffic Commission Minutes

The Regular Meeting of the Traffic Commission was held on Tuesday, July 25, 2017 at 10:30 am in the City Council Committee Room, City Hall. Members present: Chairman-Police Chief David Giorgi, DPW Commissioner John Ghiloni and Fire Chief Kevin Breen. Also present: City Engineer Tom DiPersio, Assistant City Engineer Tim Collins and City Councilor Ed Clancy, City Councilor Rob Tunnera, City Councilor Katie Robey, City Counselor Dave Doucette and Dave McCay, from Mirick O'Connell. Minutes taken by: Karen Lambert, MPD Records Clerk.

The Meeting was originally scheduled for 10:00 am but delayed until 10:30 am since no quorum was present. The Traffic Commission needs to have at least three members present to hold an official meeting. Fire Chief Breen was delayed at another meeting.

1- Minutes

The minutes of the Traffic Commission meeting of Wednesday, June 28, 2017.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED: TO APPROVE -- Accept and Place on File

2 - New Business

2a) Parking Issue at Shawmut and Maple (Update).

Chief Giorgi received an email from Karen Boule, advising that local resident Stefanie Ferrecchia was looking for an update on this issue. She advised that Ms. Ferrecchia had previously been working with Chief Leonard on "illegal parking at the intersection of Shawmut and Maple Streets which make egress at Maple and Shawmut clearly dangerous". Ms. Boule also forwarded an email she received on 6/27/17 from Ms. Ferrecchia regarding a bad accident at this intersection that she stated is "totally the fault of that electric company and its employees parking right up to the corners and on the sidewalks."

Tim Collins provided a GIS aerial photo of the intersection. Chief Giorgi had two photos that he took this morning showing that the view was obstructed. Vehicles are parking on each side out of Bridge Street. Tim Collins advised that parking is not allowed within 20 feet of an Intersection. The other issue is that people are parking on the sidewalk on Shawmut. There is no curbing and it's easy to just pull over onto the sidewalk. Also, with the curve in the road, view is obstructed by the building. There is also frequently a boat or car trailer parked at the corner. It was discussed that the boat at the corner is legally parked but when you make the turn with the boat or trailer there the lane becomes too narrow to make the curve.

Tim Collins advised that he can look into proper signage and review the no parking area.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED to REFER to ENGINEERING to review and advise.

2b) Request for Crosswalk on Northboro Road East.

Chief Giorgi received this request from Marlborough Hills Rehab. Employees of Marlborough Hills use the parking lot at the Double Tree Hotel across the street since they have limited parking onsite. They pay the hotel for this service. There is concern about traffic and speeding with their employees trying to cross the street.

Tim Collins advised that the Traffic Commission has received this request a few times before. Marlborough Hills is looking for a mid-block crosswalk and there is no curb cut there either. They want a crosswalk that is specifically for their property. There is not enough traffic volume to place a crosswalk at this location specifically for their use. Mr. Collins also noted that a crosswalk gives a false sense of security that this is a safe place to cross. It is actually better just to look both ways and wait to cross safely.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED to REFER to the POLICE DEPARTMENT. Chief Giorgi advised that he would contact Marlborough Hills and explain what was discussed at the meeting.

2c) Warning Sign Permit - Application - Beach Street.

When this issue was initially reported, it was also learned that there was a deaf child living on the street. Chief Giorgi advised that he went out to speak to the family and brought them the application for a specific warning sign that could be placed on the street for additional safety. The completed application is being submitted for a vote. The application would need to be renewed annually.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED to APPROVE the application for a warning sign indicating "Slow Deaf Child Area" on Beach Street. All in Favor.

2d) Warning Sign Permit - Renewal Application - Goodale Street

The completed renewal application for a warning sign indicating "Caution Handicap Area" was submitted for a vote.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED to APPROVE the renewal application. All in Favor.

3-Old Business

3a) Traffic Commission rules and regulations update.

Karen Lambert advised that the Police Department recently received the new pages for the Rules and Regulations Manuel. She will review them to be sure that all the requested amendments have been included.

Lisa Thomas was not in attendance to discuss this issue.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED to TABLE.

3b) Request for stop signs on Weed St. at Florence St.

Commissioner Ghiloni advised that this issue is still pending and needs to stay on the agenda.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED to TABLE.

3c) Elm Street @ Bigelow St. intersection concerns.

Engineering has been working to determine the best option for the concerns at this intersection. Tim Collins reviewed that there is a warning sign near Nashoba Dr. indicating that there is a stop sign ahead. It was originally on the wrong side of the road and too far away. The sign has been moved to the proper location. Vegetation has also been cut back to make the stop sign clearly visible. They are now looking at changing the opening of the roadway and made pavement markings to this effect. The visual appears very narrow and there have been many concerns from area residents that the proposed turn movement would be too narrow. Tom DiPersio said that it is deceiving to look at right now because of where the current center line is located and it was just repainted. It is actually the same alignment that the planning board uses for all new subdivisions.

Chief Giorgi also advised that he recently spoke to Councilor Juiare about this also and that he had asked about the possibility of installing 2 flashing electronic stop signs. There was further discussion about the cost of these signs (approx. \$2,000 each) and that the City received just as many complaints about the signs because they are too bright and some people just don't like them.

Councilor Robey asked if it was just the pavement lines that we were talking about moving. Mr. DiPersio said no that they are looking to take out the pavement and change the curve of the road.

Upon further discussion, the Traffic Commission is not ready to vote on any changes. Engineering would like to table for another month for further review.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED to TABLE.

3d) Vehicles Speed and Safety Assessment – Bolton Street (Route 85)

Tim Collins provided a memo with his comments/recommendations to the Traffic Safety Plan proposed by McMahon and Associates in conjunction with the Benchmark Senior Living project at 421 Bolton Street.

Pavement Markings

They were proposing two 12-foot travel lanes on the shoulders that act as a "traffic calming" measure that would slow traffic through the area. Mr. Collins said that the City did this on Curtis Ave. and it seems to be working. His only concern is that the shoulders that would be created could then be used as "parking lanes". He is suggesting that a no parking regulation also be incorporated into the design.

Signage

The signage plan includes advance warning signs and the replacing of existing signs and placing them on new posts. Mr. Collins said in his memo, "as this is a sidewalk plow route, signs on utilities poles last longer than signs on their own post". He is recommending that the new signage be installed and that the locations remain where they are, however, he would like to see the signs on the poles or off the sidewalk so they are not in the way of the plow.

Crosswalk

Mr. Collins also noted that the current crosswalk at the driveway of 397 Bolton Street is not A.D.A. compliant on the opposite side. Councilor Clancy had asked about having this addressed.

Electronic Speed Signage

These signs (with electronic speed feedback) have been used in other areas of the City and work very well and help to deter speeding in the area. Councilor Clancy had also suggested that these signs be used here.

Councilor Robey asked about the posted speed. Tim Collins advised that it is posted at 35 mph in this area of Bolton Street, however, it increases to 40mph at Bolton Street Tavern. He explained how speed studies work and how the posted speed is based on what 85% of drivers are traveling. The road opens up over the lake and people tend to go faster here.

The group discussed making these suggestions a condition of Site Plan Approval.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED to ACCEPT the recommendations outlined in the memo prepared by Tim Collins. All in Favor.

3e) Speeding on Beach Street

Chief Giorgi advised that one of the new speed signs that provides feedback is at this location now and that he had the speed trailer there out there before. The neighbors are very happy with the sign; however, it can't stay there. The Chief said that the Police Department would continue to monitor speed here.

Tim Collins advised that two other signs are faded and will be replaced.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED to REFER to the POLICE DEPARTMENT for continued enforcement and to ENGINEERING to replace the faded signs.

3f) Hudson Street bike path concerns.

Commissioner Ghiloni advised that green pavement similar to that on Hudson Street will also be added to the two other crossing areas (Ash Street and at Boston Scientific). A special paint is used and it costs \$2,000 to paint each one. They have also requested permission from MADOT to paint the crosswalk at Fitchburg Street.

Councilor Robey asked if it would be possible to put signs on the bike path telling people which way to walk or ride. She uses the bike path and has constant issues with people in her way when she is on her bike. Commissioner Ghiloni advised that the City owns the bike path and he will have arrows painted on the path to indicate the direction of bike travel.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED to REFER to the DPW for painting.

That there being no further business of the Traffic Commission held on this date, the meeting adjourned at 11:00 am.



4: Public Hearings: (7:15 p.m.)

A. 72 Hager St. – Definitive Subdivision Plan – Applicant South Coast Advisors LLC

Chairperson Fenby opened the public hearing at 7:15 p.m. Ms. Hughes read the public hearing notice into the record. The hearing proceeded in the following order:

Presentation by applicant representative, Peter Bemis, Engineering Design Consultants, Inc.

Those speaking in favor

Those speaking in opposition

Questions from Board Members

Presentation: Peter Bemis began with an introduction of the property owners, Mark Wambolt, Sr. and Mark Wambolt, Jr. of South Coast Advisors. Mr. Bemis provided some historical background on previous designs for the property, including a conventional five-lot subdivision as well as a four-lot open space plan. Given the preference to preserve open space and the continued moratorium on residential special permit applications, the applicant wishes to present the plan submitted to the Board at tonight's public hearing.

Mr. Bemis explained the plan requires numerous Planning Board waivers, but is the preferred plan with only three building lots on a cul-de-sac. The 2.56 acre agricultural-use open space (access from Boston Post Road) would be for cow grazing and a barn to winter cows.

The subdivision plans do not show the proposed barn. A draft Conservation Restriction (CR) prepared by Attorney Arthur Anderson is included in the agenda packet.

Mr. Bemis provided an overview of each of the waiver requests as follows:

- Request waiver from the required 25-foot radius at property line intersections with Hager
 St. (to 12' and 0')
- Request waiver from the required width of 50' Right of Way (to 30')
- Request waiver from Dead-End-Streets required 100' property line diameter (to 40'-described as adequate to accommodate the turning around of the City's largest emergency vehicle an aerial ladder truck.)
- Request waiver from the maximum 3% slope requirement (5% requested through the culde-sac.)
- Waiver from required width of 26' (to 18' only three lots and width still allows 2-way passage of cars.)
- Request waiver of sidewalks, curbs and gutter as road is private and has only three dwellings.
- Request waiver from providing street trees as road remains private and individual lots will be landscaped.
- Request waiver from providing monuments as road will remain private.
- Request waiver from providing street signs as dwelling addresses will be off Hager St.
- Request waiver from providing street lights as road will remain private in a rural setting.

Homes will be serviced by septic systems, underground utilities and infiltrated roof drainage systems. In accordance with state regulations, a stormwater management plan has been provided. Q: Mr. Fay — What does the stormwater management plan look like? Mr. Bemis indicated that roof water will enter ground chambers, and roadway runoff will enter a stone trench with a pipe to overflow into the farm pond.

Ms. Hughes read comments from Conservation Officer, Priscilla Ryder, into the record. Ms. Priscilla Ryder indicated she had received a copy of a draft Conservation Restriction (CR) for the property. This matter will be reviewed by the Conservation Commission for comment. On a motion by Mr. Fay, seconded by Ms. Hughes, the Board voted to accept the comments and place on file. Motion carried.

Mr. LaVenture directed a question about the open space to Mr. Bemis. Noting that the CR places the word "barn" in quotations, Mr. LaVenture asked whether there were any plans for the space beyond housing livestock. Mr. Bemis indicated the owner plans to build an approximate 30' x 50' barn, including a hay loft and paddock area. Mr. Bemis said that Attorney Anderson likely wrote the draft CR to avoid being "boxed in" or limited in their ability to either work the farm — to grow and sell produce, for example, or to maintain farm equipment on the premises. Mr. LaVenture furthered that the word "artisan" in the CR implies a potential business use for the property. Mr. Bemis reiterated his feelings that the CR is written to provide some flexibility to the owners.

On a motion by Ms. Hughes and seconded by Mr. Fay, the Board voted to refer the draft Conservation Restriction (CR) to the City's Legal Department for comment. Motion carried. On a motion by Ms. Hughes and seconded by Mr. Fay, the Board voted to refer the definitive subdivision plan to Engineering for comment. Motion carried.

Ms. Fenby asked whether anyone in attendance wished to speak in favor of the project. **Speaking in favor:**

Doug Stanczak of 40 Hager St. Mr. Stanczak indicated he preferred this three-lot plan with open space over the five-lot conventional plan. Mr. Stanczak wanted to express two concerns. He went to some length to remove trees from his property to provide sun to his lot, and he hopes that the trees from the open space do not overshadow his solar installation. His second concern is relative to a potential bus stop in the area. When his children were young, the bus stop was on Boston Post Road. With no sidewalk or crosswalk in the area, he felt that it was important to plan for a safe bus stop for any residents in the development.

Phil Bailey of 47 Hager St. Mr. Bailey asked for clarity on what types of dwellings were planned for the subdivision. With permission from the Chair, Mr. Bemis responded that the square footage for the homes would be in the high 2000's to low 3000's.

Speaking in opposition:

No person spoke in opposition.

Ms. Hughes read comments from Cathleen Liberty, Director of Public Health, in the City of Marlborough. Ms. Liberty indicated there were eight passing percolation tests completed on 10/16/16 and ten acceptable deep hole tests on file. Once test location plans are submitted to the Board of Health, the department can comment more definitively on the site's suitability to support septic systems.

Ms. Hughes read comments submitted by Fire Chief Breen. Chief Breen summarized his concerns related to the width of the proposed road (common driveway) for this subdivision, the narrowing of any turning into this driveway from Hager Street and the small size of the cul-de-sac. He also indicated that the roadway should be built to acceptable City standards to ensure the road can withstand the weight of modern fire apparatus (35+ tons). He also requests that any approval of this configuration be conditioned on posting/installing permanent, sequential street numbers referring to the homes to be located off the common driveway.

Police Chief Giorgi has no comments on the subdivision plan.

On a motion by Mr. Fay, seconded by Ms. Hughes, the Board voted to accept the comments and place on file. Motion carried.

Chairperson Fenby requested that a discussion of the project's waivers be placed on the agenda for September 11, 2017.

The public hearing was closed at 7:52 p.m.

In preparation for the next meeting of the Planning Board, members summarized the following discussion points:

- Are there any restrictions on the Boston Post Road opening to the open space?
- Preferred drainage designs
- Conservation Restriction viewpoints of both the Conservation Commission and Legal Dept.
- Fire Dept. design feedback and waivers

Approval of Minutes – The Commission unanimously approved the minutes of July 20, 2017 as written.

Public Hearings

Abbreviated Notice of Intent 1001 Boston Post Rd. - Raytheon Company

Aron Alfred of John Crow Associates and Mike Laggerio, facilities manager of Raytheon were present. Mr. Laggerio explained that the 30-year-old transformer switch gear needs replacement. A new switch system will be installed next to the existing system and a 10'x10' pad needs to be poured. Unfortunately, due to the configuration of the parking lot, it needs to extend into the 20' buffer zone. Mr. Alfred explained that the area was already graded and mowed, so minimal excavation is needed and no wetland vegetation or native buffer zone vegetation is to be removed. Work will include excavation and installation of the 100-sq. ft. pad and the removal and relocation of a light post with associated trench and duct work. The Commission discussed construction methods, erosion control location and stabilization of the site once work is completed. After further discussion, the Commission closed the hearing and voted unanimously 6-0 to issue a standard Order of Conditions requiring a pre-construction meeting and stabilization when through.

Discussions:

Elm Street Culvert – DEP 212-1149

Bill Lovenbury Sr. from Aqua Line Utility and Tim Collins from DPW Engineering were both present. Ms. Ryder noted that per the Order of Conditions, the contractor chosen for the project needed to come to a regularly scheduled Commission meeting to discuss the construction sequencing and weather-related issues for this stream/culvert restoration project. Mr. Lovenbury explained that they have not yet found the waterline sleeve. If they find it and can use it, they will.... if not, per the Order of Conditions, they will need to excavate through the stream to install a new sleeve through which the waterline can be placed. They will stockpile the river stones and wetland soils in a designated area to keep for reuse in the replication area and to re-establish the stream bottom. After some

discussion of the method for pumping and being aware of the weather, the Commission was <u>satisfied</u> and told the <u>DPW</u> and <u>Mr. Lovenbury that they could proceed with the project.</u>

• Ft. Meadow Commission Request – draw down of Ft. Meadow – Fall 2017 – This item was continued to the September 7th meeting.

Correspondence/Other Business:

- Letter to Jennifer Grant, Community Manager Bell Partners, dated July 19, 2017 RE: Emergency Certificate for 20 Applebriar Lane, Marlborough, Sewer pipe repair and cleanup. The Commission reviewed the Emergency Certificate issued for the project and voted unanimously 6-0 to ratify the emergency certificate.
- Eversource As part of the transmission line that is proposed between Sudbury and Hudson which crosses through The Desert Natural Area in Marlborough, Eversource has asked for permission to do a study of the priority habitat in this area to gather information to inform the Environmental Impact Report they are preparing. The Commission voted unanimously to grant permission with conditions that the Commission be notified of dates this will occur, be able to observe this work, and be notified when results are submitted to the NHESP.
- OARS OARS has received a grant to install river access signs at all river boat access points
 along the Assabet River. They have asked for permission to post these signs at the Robin Hill
 and Donald Lynch Blvd. boat access sites. The Commission voted unanimously to grant
 permission.
- Hager St. Subdivision Plan Ms. Ryder noted that the Commission had received a copy of a
 proposed subdivision plan for comment. The Commission reviewed the plan and asked for
 further clarification on how the open space would be designated before giving comment to the
 Planning Board. Ms. Ryder will inquire.
