Dear President Vigeant and Members:

In August 2008, the City Council approved an amendment to the procedures for processing claims against the City. More specifically, the amendment provided an expedited method for processing claims alleging damage to residential mailboxes caused by the operation of snow plows. The Council renewed its approval of this Order in 2009.

The 2009 renewal contained a sunset provision stipulating that the amendment would expire on June 30, 2010 "unless prior to expiration the City Council determines it is appropriate to extend this amendment beyond June 30, 2010." Accordingly, I am proposing that the ordinance be renewed at this time. If the Council approves that renewal, the residential mailbox claim procedure would be in place in time for the 2010-2011 winter season.

For your reference, please note that, during the 2009-2010 winter season, four (4) residential mailbox claims were presented to the City; and that a total of \$213.01 was paid to those claimants.

This paragraph shall be applicable to only those mailbox claims accruing on or after November 1, 2010.

The foregoing amendment to Section 7-13 of Chapter 7 of Article II of the Code of the City of Marlborough, as amended, shall expire on June 30, 2011 unless prior to expiration the City Council determines it is appropriate to extend this amendment beyond June 30, 2011.


