 (a) Application Fee in the amount of \$500.00; (b) three (3) original copies of the Application for Amendment to Special Permit # 07-1001465D; (c) Certification of Delivery of copies of application to City of Marlborough Departments and Office of the City Council; (d) Certification of Payment of Municipal Taxes; (e) Application outlining the project; (f) Special Permit Application Certification by Planning Department; (g) Certified copies of Abutters' Lists; (h) Special Permit-Summary Impact Statement; (collectively the "Documents"). Twelve sets of Documents were delivered to the City Council and one set each to the Police Chief, the Fire Chief, the City Planner, the Building Inspector, the City Engineer and the Conservation Officer, all in accordance with Chapter 650, Article VII Section 200-59 of the Zoning Code of the City of Marlborough. The documents are incorporated herein and become part of this Decision.
- 7. The Applicant filed with the Application a Certificate of Completeness of Application on a form signed on behalf of the City Planner for the City of Marlborough as having complied with the provisions of Chapter 650 (Zoning Code) Article VII Section 650-59, C. (7) (a), (b), and (c).

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- 8. In accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the City Council and Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 40A Sections 9 and 11, the City Council established September 13, 2010 at 8:00 PM as a date and time for a public hearing on the Application, caused a notice of said hearing and the date thereof to be advertised on August 23, 2010 and August 30, 2010 in the Metrowest Daily News and caused said notice to be mailed to those entitled thereto. Proof of advertisement and mailing were submitted to the City Clerk to be placed with the Application documents.
- 9. The Marlborough City Council held a public hearing on the Application on September 13, 2010 at 8:00 PM in accordance with the published notice, (the Public Hearing). The hearing was opened and closed on said date.
- 10. At the public hearing, the Applicant presented a slide presentation showing the area in the building known as the Kick Back Club. The slides showed the area where the service bar would be located and the area where the beer and wine would be consumed. Applicant gave testimony through its attorney that the ability to serve beer and wine would increase the applicant's competitiveness with other similar facilities in the area; that it would attract more men's leagues, company and corporate functions, private functions, such as adult birthday parties, bar Mitzvahs, and fundraising events to support youth and adult athletic leagues and other private fundraising functions; and that it would allow the Applicant to be more competitive in attracting local, regional and national events, resulting in the use by participants of the local hospitality facilities, such as hotels and restaurants. Members of the public had the opportunity to testify at the public hearing. Some members of the public spoke in favor of the granting of the Permit and others spoke against. There were letters and e-mails in support of the granting of the Permit and e-mails in opposition to Application.

BASED UPON THE ABOVE THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARLBOROUGH MAKES THE FOLLOWING FINDINGS AND CONDITIONS:

- A. The City Council finds that it may amend Special Permit # 07-1001465D (Special Permit) subject to terms and conditions as it deems necessary and reasonable to protect the citizens of the City of Marlborough.
- **B.** The City Council finds the Application for Amendment to Special Permit does not derogate from the intent or purpose of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Marlborough or Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 40A, et. seq.
- C. The City Council finds that the proposed use of the Site for the limited sale of beer and wine is an appropriate use and is in harmony with the general purpose and intent of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Marlborough.
- **D.** The Applicant has complied with all the procedural rules and regulations of the City Council of the City of Marlborough, Chapter 650 (Zoning Code) of the City of Marlborough and Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 40A Sections 9 and 11.

GRANT OF AMENDMENT TO SPECIAL PERMIT

- E. The City Council of the City of Marlborough pursuant to its authority under Chapter 650 (Zoning Code) of the Code of the City of Marlborough and Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 40A, GRANTS to the Applicant an Amendment to Special Permit # 07-1001465D to allow the serving and consumption of alcoholic beer and wine. as set forth in the Application and subject to the following conditions:
 - 1. The Special Permit # 07-1001465D is hereby affirmed, is deemed to be in full force and effect and applies to the Project without change or modification, except as provided for herein.
 - 2. Unless modified by the provisions hereof, conditions 1 through 18 and conditions 20 through 54 outlined in the Special Permit shall apply to the Project. Where reference is made to the issuance of the Special Permit, it shall also refer to the issuance of the Amended Special Permit.
 - 3. Condition 19 of the Special Permit shall be deleted in its entirety and in place thereof the following shall be inserted:
 - 19. **Serving of Alcoholic Beverages.** A. (a) During the period of time from the granting of the Amendment to Special Permit # 07-1001465D to August 31, 2011, Applicant may serve beer and wine on no more than 25 days, all in accordance with the terms and conditions in B. (a) through (j) hereof. (b) Each day the Applicant intends to serve beer and wine during said period, Applicant shall notify the Zoning Code Enforcing Authority of the intent to serve on that particular day. Prior to September 1, 2011, the City Council reserves the right to review the amended special permit allowing the serving of alcoholic beverages. (c) So long as there is no violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 138 ALCOHOLIC LIQUORS, the City of Marlborough Licensing Board Rules and Regulations or Section 19 of this Grant of Amendment to Special Permit, and the Chief of Police and the Zoning Code Enforcing Authority state in writing that there has been no violation prior to September 1, 2011, then, on and after September 1, 2011, Applicant may serve beer and wine on any day in the Kick Back Club in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Grant of Amendment to Special Permit. B. Alcoholic beverages consisting of beer and wine only may be served by the Applicant to be consumed on the Site and only in the area on the second floor of the building designated as Kick Back Club under the following terms and conditions: (a) Alcoholic beverages may only be served in the Kick Back Club; (b) There shall be no bar facilities for patron seating. All seating shall be at tables in the Kick Back Club area; (c) No alcoholic beverages are allowed to be taken out of the Kick Back Club; (d) No

alcoholic beverages are allowed to be served outside of the Kick Back Club; (e) The serving of alcoholic beverages shall be limited to the hours of 4:00 PM to 11:30 PM Monday through Sunday; (f) For special events and catered functions Applicant may serve beer and wine between the hours of 12:00 noon and 11:30 PM. Special Events are private events, such as a birthday party, a bar mitzvah, a fund raiser or other social functions which are held in the Kick Back Club; (g) Food such as snacks, hot dogs, sandwiches and pizza shall be available for purchase in the Kick Back Club during the time that beer and wine is served; (h) Alcoholic beverages shall not be served one half hour before, during and one half hour after public school or private school games. (i) No alcoholic beverages may be consumed at any time in any area outside of the permitted area, including but not limited to the parking lots; (i) The Applicant has provided the City Council with its Alcohol Policy Handbook; and the Applicant shall implement the policy and performance of the policy as a condition of the Amended Permit.

- 4. In accordance with the provisions of Mass. Gen. Laws c. 40A, § 11, the Applicant at its expense shall record this Amendment to Special Permit in the Middlesex South Registry of Deeds after the City Clerk has certified that the twenty day period for appealing this Special Permit has elapsed with no appeal having been filed. Upon said recording, Applicant shall forthwith provide a copy of the recorded Special Permit to the City Council's office and to the City Solicitor's office.
- 5. The issuance of the Amended Special Permit is further subject to the issuance of a Beer and Wine License by the City of Marlborough Licensing Board with the approval of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission.

During the Incident Period of March 12, 2010 through April 26, 2010, severe storms and flooding occurred in the City of Marlborough, penetrating the road surface and causing a capstone of the stone culvert below to dislodge. Water flow then washed away the gravel (6' W x 6' L x 3.5' D)/27 = 4.7 CY = 6 TN under the southbound ane of Bolton St at the entrance to Assabet Valley Technical School causing the pavement to sink and become a safety hazard.



DECISION ON A SPECIAL PERMIT CLEAR WIRELESS, LLC CITY COUNCIL ORDER NO. 10-1002648B

Re: 115 Onamog Street, Marlborough, MA

The City Council of the City of Marlborough hereby GRANTS the application for a Special Permit to CLEAR WIRELESS, LLC, a Nevada Limited Liability Company having a usual place of business at 4400 Carillon Point, Kirkland, WA 98033, as provided in the Decision and subject to the following Findings of Fact and Conditions.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Applicant is CLEAR WIRELESS, LLC, a Nevada Limited Liability Company which has a business address of 4400 Carillon Point, Kirkland, WA 98033, and is an affiliate of Sprint Wireless Broadband Company, LLC and Nextel Communications of the Mid-Atlantic, Inc. (hereinafter "Applicant").
- 2. Through its Application for a Special Permit (hereinafter "Application"), the Applicant seeks permission to install three (3) panel antennas, six (6) "back-haul" dish antennas, and an array of three (3) Remote Radio Heads, all on two mounting bands at the approximate height of 87 feet on the existing municipal water tank, as well as the placement of one (1) associated radio equipment cabinet within a proposed extension of the existing chain link fenced area, one (1) GPS antenna, and associated coax cables and cable trays (hereinafter "Proposed WCD Project"), substantially as depicted on a set of plans entitled "Fairmont Hill Water Tank MA-BOS5415-A" by Bay State Design and dated 04/05/10 provided as part of the Application (hereinafter "Plans").
- 3. The location of the Proposed WCD Project is 115 Onamog Street, Marlborough, MA. The site is more particularly identified on the Assessor's Map of the City of Marlborough as Map 81, Block 238 (hereinafter "the Site"). The owner of record for the Site is the City of Marlborough.
- 4. The Applicant is a lessee of the owner for purposes of this Application.
- 5. The Site is zoned A-3 (Residence). Wireless communication devices are allowed by grant of Special Permit in A-3 (Residence) Zoning Districts.
- 6. The Special Permit is being sought pursuant to Article VI, Section 650-25 and Article VIII, Section 650-59 of the Zoning Code of the City of Marlborough.
- 7. Pursuant to the Rules and Regulations of Application for Special Permit (hereinafter "Rules and Regulations"), the Building Inspector on behalf of the City Planner certified that the Special Permit application materials are complete



- and conform to said Rules and Regulations and that the Plans conform in all respects to the City Code.
- 8. The Applicant has complied with all of the applicable Rules and Regulations.
- 9. The City of Marlborough City Council held a public hearing on the Proposed WCD Project on September 27, 2010, for which proper notice had been published and for which proper notice had been given to all parties entitled to notice under the law.
- 10. The Applicant presented oral testimony and demonstrative evidence at the public hearing demonstrating that the Proposed WCD Project meets all the applicable Special Permit criteria of Article VI, Section 650-25 and Article VIII, Section 650-59.
- 11. The Applicant provided further oral testimony and demonstrative evidence to the City Council's Wireless Communications Committee regarding the Proposed WCD Project's compliance with the applicable Special Permit criteria.
- 12. The Council, in reviewing the Applicant's Application, considered the Review Standards and Development Requirements, as enumerated in Article VI, Section 650-25 and Article VIII, Section 650-59 of the City of Marlborough Zoning Ordinance, applicable to the proposed Wireless Communications Device.

BASED UPON THE ABOVE, THE MARLBOROUGH CITY COUNCIL MAKES THE FOLLOWING FINDINGS OF FACT AND TAKES THE FOLLOWING ACTIONS

- A) The Applicant has complied with all the Rules and Regulations promulgated by the Marlborough City Council pertaining to the said Application.
- B) The Site is an appropriate location for the Proposed WCD Project and the Proposed WCD Project is in harmony with the general purpose and intent of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Marlborough when subject to the appropriate terms and conditions of this Approval.
- C) The Applicant has complied with the applicable Review Standards and Development Requirements pertaining to Wireless Communications Devices, enumerated in Article VI, Section 650-25 and Article VIII, Section 650-59 of the City of Marlborough Zoning Ordinance, by siting, designing and screening its proposed WCD Project to minimize adverse impact on the abutting neighborhood and on nearby residential properties.
- D) The Council, pursuant to its authority under Mass. Gen. Laws Chapter 40A and the City of Marlborough Zoning Ordinance, GRANTS the Applicant a Special Permit, SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS NUMBERED 1 THROUGH 12:

- The Proposed WCD Project shall be constructed, maintained and operated according to the specifications, terms and conditions of the Applicant's Application, as amended during the application/hearing/Wireless Communications Committee process, and in compliance with the Conditions of the Grant of Special Permit as well as with the conditions set forth in Chapter 650-25F of the Marlborough Zoning Ordinance.
- 2) All plans, site evaluations, briefs and other documentation provided by the Applicant as part of this Application are herein incorporated into and become a part of this Special Permit and become conditions and requirements of the same, unless otherwise altered by the City Council.
- The Applicant shall comply with all rules, regulations, ordinances and statutes of the City of Marlborough, the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the Federal Government as they may apply to the construction, maintenance and operation of the Proposed WCD Project.
- 4) All terms, conditions, requirements, approvals, plans and drawings required hereunder are hereby made a part of and incorporated herein as a condition to the issuance of this Special Permit.
- 5) Applicant shall minimize the visual impacts of the Proposed WCD Project by screening and/or color coordination as may be depicted on the Plans and other demonstrative evidence submitted as part of the Application.
- Applicant shall pay to the City of Marlborough Open Space Account #100-2410-44515, as mitigation for the alleged impacts caused by the subject of this Permit, the annual sum of One Thousand Five Hundred (\$1,500.00) dollars, the first payment due and payable at the time of the issuance of the building permit hereunder, or within one year of the approval of Special Permit, whichever is earlier, and the subsequent payments to be due and payable on January 2, or the first business day thereafter, of each calendar year in which the Proposed WCD Project referenced in this Permit is still in operation. Failure to make the payment in a timely manner shall constitute a violation of the Special Permit, and the Applicant shall pay an additional sum of \$500 per quarter or portion thereof after the payment due date that the Applicant has failed to make payment.
- Applicant shall not utilize a permanent electrical generator, of any type, in connection with the operation of the Proposed WCD Project. Applicant shall be permitted to use a temporary electrical generator in connection with the operation of the Proposed WCD Project only in cases of power outages to the Proposed WCD Project and for purposes of routine testing and maintenance. The temporary generator shall be utilized in a safe manner and the noise produced by the temporary generator shall conform

to the City's noise ordinance set forth in Chapter 431 of the City Code.

- 8) No operation of the Proposed WCD Project shall commence until the Applicant has received written approval from the Building Inspector that all the above conditions have been satisfied.
- Plan Review, if applicable, in accordance with the City of Marlborough ordinance, prior to the issuance of the actual Building Permit. Any additional changes, alterations, modifications or amendments as required by Site Plan Review shall be further conditions attached to the building permit and no certificate of use and occupancy shall be issued until all conditions are complied with by Applicant. Further, any additional changes, alterations, modifications or amendments as required by Site Plan Review shall be further conditions attached to this Special Permit, and any non-compliance with said changes, alterations, modifications or amendments shall constitute a violation of this Special Permit.
- In accordance with the provisions of Mass. Gen. Laws c. 40A, § 11, the Applicant at its expense shall record this Special Permit in the Middlesex South Registry of Deeds after the City Clerk has certified that the twenty-day period for appealing this Special Permit has elapsed with no appeal having been filed, and said recording shall be made before a building permit is issued. Applicant shall forthwith provide a copy of the recorded Special Permit to the City Council's office and to the City Solicitor's office.
- 11) As soon as practicable but in any event within one (1) month after the date when a certificate of use and occupancy has been issued to the Applicant by the City of Marlborough's Building Commissioner for the Proposed WCD Project, Applicant shall submit a written report to the City Council; provided, however, that if the Proposed WCD Project has not yet become operational within the one-month period after said issuance date, then the Applicant must immediately provide the City Council with written notification as to the date when the Proposed WCD Project does become operational and, further, must submit said written report within one (1) month after said operational date. The written report to the City Council i) shall provide measurements as to the actual output of radio frequency energy emitted by the Proposed WCD Project; ii) shall include a professional opinion by a third party certifying that the Proposed WCD Project fully complies with all applicable health and safety standards; and iii) shall provide measurements of the actual output of the total radio frequency energy being emitted by all Wireless Communications Facilities (as defined in Section 650-25 of the Marlborough Zoning Ordinance) then located at the Site. The Applicant agrees to operate its Proposed WCD Project in compliance with all applicable health and safety standards. In the event that there are any changes in or upgrades to the Proposed WCD

Project that may increase the actual output of radio frequency energy emitted by the Proposed WCD Project, the Applicant shall submit a letter to the City Council as soon as practicable but in any event within one (1) month after the date of completion of those changes or upgrades. The letter i) shall state what the changes or upgrades are; ii) shall provide measurements specifying how the actual output of radio frequency energy emitted by the Proposed WCD Project has been increased; iii) shall provide measurements of the actual output of all radio frequency energy being emitted by all hereinbefore-defined Wireless Communications Facilities then located at the Site; and iv) shall include a professional opinion by a third party certifying that the Applicant's changes or upgrades have not caused the total radio frequency energy being emitted by all hereinbefore-defined Wireless Communications Facilities then located at the Site to exceed any applicable health and safety standards.

Subject to final agreement between the City of Marlborough and the Applicant, the Applicant shall execute a lease agreement with the City of Marlborough to be drafted by the City Solicitor, approved by the Chief Procurement Officer and executed by the Mayor, and the Applicant shall provide the necessary insurance and indemnification provisions as required by said lease.





Traffic Commission

The Regular Meeting of the Traffic Commission was held on Tuesday, August 31st, 2010 at 10:05 a.m. in City Council Committee Room, City Hall. Members present: Chairman Police Chief Mark Leonard, Vice Chairman – DPW Commissioner Ronald LaFreniere and City Clerk Lisa Thomas. Also present: City Engineer Thomas Cullen, Asst. Civil Engineer Tim Collins, City Councilor Rob Tunnera, City Councilor Trisha Pope and Code Enforcement Officer Pam Wilderman. Minutes taken by: Karen Lambert, MPD Records Clerk.

1- Minutes

The minutes of the Traffic Commission meeting of Tuesday, July 27th, 2010.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED: To APPROVE.

2-New Business

2a. Communication from Theora Cole, re: Hildreth St. and Curtis Ave. speeding concerns.

Ms. Cole, a local resident, sent an e-mail expressing her concerns with speeding, accidents and traffic at this location. Chief Leonard was not aware of "a lot of accidents" at this intersection since the bushes have been cut back to alleviate sight concerns. He is aware, however, that this area is used as a "cut through" street. Ron LaFreniere mentioned the timing on the lights at the intersection of East Main and Curtis Ave. They intentionally used a minimal timing sequence here to deter drivers from using this area as a cut through. Chief Leonard advised that he would try to get the speed board out to this location.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED to refer to the POLICE DERPARTMENT for enforcement and to ENGINEERING to review the signalization at this intersection.

2b. Communication from Rep. Gregoire, re: Request for crosswalk on Hosmer St. at Grace Circle.

Tim Collins presented an areal photo of this location with the existing crosswalks highlighted in yellow. He advised that it would be repetitious to put another crosswalk at Grace Circle when there is already one in front of Jaworek School and at Stacey Road. There is a sidewalk on Hosmer and someone can easily walk down Hosmer and cross at one of the existing crosswalks. Ron LaFreniere advised that Jaworek School has received a grant for new sidewalks internal to the sight. The MADOT is in the preliminary development stage and is looking at potential sidewalk and crosswalk improvements in this area. Chief Leonard noted that in spite of any changes around the school there is no need for an additional crosswalk at Grace Circle.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED to refer to Chief Leonard to contact Representative Gregoire.

2c) Communication from Renato Alpizar, re: Signage on Stow Road.

Chief Leonard noted that there are no special speed regulations on Stow Road. It is considered a "thickly settled area" so we cannot erect standard signs that state 30 mph. The most we could do would be "thickly settled signage". The Commission does not typically approve signage involving children, i.e. "children ahead". He feels that the bulk of this is an enforcement issue, however, we can have engineering can look into "thickly settled" signage.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED to refer to the POLICE DEPARTMENT for enforcement and to ENGINEERING for possible signage.

2d) Pleasant Street parking restrictions between Chestnut St. and Elm St.

Chief Leonard received a phone call and an e-mail from a local resident regarding confusing signage near 117 Pleasant St. There is currently a sign which appears to indicate both a 30 minute parking restriction and "No Parking" at the same time. Ron LaFreniere looked into the history behind this and it appears that the 30 minute parking restriction went into place in 1953, well before there were any parking restrictions on the East side of the street. In 1966, another ordinance went into place establishing "No Parking" on the east side of Pleasant Street between West Main and Elm, without acknowledging the 30 minute restriction already in existence. The new ordinance effectively wiped out the prior restriction. The Commission went on to discuss if 30 minute parking was necessary. The Tedeschi store at this location has its own parking lot (though very limited). Pam Wilderman commented that a lot of the Tedeschi traffic is foot traffic from the local neighborhoods. Chief Leonard advised that it seems to make more sense to keep the area consistent and officially get rid of the old ordinance. Tim noted the old ordinance is still "on the books". Chief Leonard advised that he would put together the wording to officially repeal the 1953 ordinance. Tim asked if engineering should wait to swap the signs. Ron advised that it is Ok to go ahead and correct the signage because the ordinance is already in place.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED to refer to CHIEF LEONARD to prepare the appropriate wording to repeal the old ordinance and to ENGINEERING to correct the signage.



2e. Communication from Pam Wilderman, re: Chestnut Street traffic.

Pam Wilderman explained that they recently had a meeting with the property owners on Chestnut Street from Mechanic to Pleasant. One of the issues discussed was the fact that Chestnut Street becomes a "cut through" during high traffic times. She suggested the possibility of making that section of Chestnut "one way" during certain times of the day. Chief Leonard advised that he did not see this happening. Pam commented that some issues in the area have already been addressed and she has seen a noticeable improvement in the last 3 weeks, i.e. trash being picked up etc. An additional street light is already all set to go and police officers have been out there more frequently "tagging cars" for illegal parking. The problem is with cars "zipping through at high rates of speed" when there are a lot of youngsters playing here. Pam brought up the intersection of Lincoln and Lakeside Ave. where there is "no left turn between 4-6pm." and asked if something like this was possible for Chestnut Street (with a restricted left off Pleasant to Chestnut). Chief Leonard noted that this type of situation is very difficult to enforce. There was further discussion about traffic flow and busiest times of day. Chief Leonard commented that he would prefer to do "concentrated enforcement" before any other changes are considered. He said that we need to get speeds under control first and mentioned putting the speed board out to let residents know that the police department is trying to address the speed issue. Engineering also mentioned that they do have some vehicle counts for this area as a result of studies done for other purposes. Pam asked if she could have this information forwarded to her.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED to refer to the POLICE DEAPRTMENT for enforcement and to ENGINEERING to forward vehicle counts to Pam Wilderman.

3-Old Business

3c. Stop signs on Bigelow Street.

Chief Leonard presented a brief overview of this situation to the new Ward 4 Councilor, Rob Tunnera. He's received many informal complaints/comments about the stop signs here over the years; however, the Commission recently received a formal written request to revisit the issue. Engineering has since conducted formal traffic counts on Bigelow Street. The end result, as expected, was that the traffic volume does not even come close to meeting the warrants for stop signs. Now that we have specific information that tells us that the stop signs should not be there, the question is how to proceed. Commission has held off on doing anything with this information until the new Ward 4 Councilor came on board. Chief Leonard commented that the Commission has tried to be very consistent with regard to requests for stop signs. They have found that, more often than not, stop sign requests do not meet the necessary warrants. He mentioned that stop signs were installed at Elm Street and Ferrecchia Drive, due to accident data and sight line issues, and that the stop signs at Sudbury Street were removed. He said that stop signs are not the answer to speeding issues. This should be an enforcement issue. There are currently 7 stop signs on Bigelow Street and none seem to meet the warrants. Councilor Juaire, the prior Ward 4 Councilor, felt that the issue was split right down the middle. Councilor Pope disagreed; she felt that the issue was not split. She said that "you would be hard pressed to find anyone on that street who wants them down." She

would not support taking them down without a public hearing. Chief Leonard commented that he understands this is a "hot issue". Councilor Tunnera said that when he was out campaigning he did find a 50 - 50 split on this issue. Some people who actually live at the stop sign locations mentioned concerns about noise with the constant stopping and starting in front of their homes. He commented that he would want to see notices sent out to residents and a public hearing held in the evening.

Chief Leonard brought up the possibility of taking down a few of the stop signs. Trucks currently stay away from this area because of the constant downshifting with the frequent stops. He can envision a problem with the removal of the stop sign at the corner of Evelina and Bigelow. There are a lot of trees and brush that block the traffic coming down the hill when making a left turn onto Bigelow. The traffic is currently used to stopping there. Councilor Pope commented that this is an issue where "no one is going to win." Ron LaFreniere said that he tends to be "black and white" on these issues. "If warrants are met...they go in...if not...they come down." However, he is in a "quandary" on this issue. He mentioned that at one time there was a Right Turn Only condition and the end of Bigelow to discourage traffic from taking that route to the Mall. Over time, the restriction disappeared. He said that the single biggest is issue is with GPS. The hotels and rink etc. give directions from the highway but now people just put the address into their GPS and are sent down Bigelow Street. Some of the stop signs are also dangerous for motorists not familiar with the area. He also commented that the warrant analysis was done with the stop signs in place. We could end up with an accident situation if the signs are taken down because the stop signs have changed the scenario.

Lisa Thomas said that maybe we should table the issue for now and wait until the next meeting when the Fire Chief is also here and then decide on a time and date for a public hearing. She felt that we need to have some type of proposal in place before the public hearing and try to define a "best scenario". Tom Collins asked if it would be helpful to conduct a resident survey. Ron commented that if we were holding a "legal public hearing" we would need to present a formal proposal but he felt that maybe this should be more of an information session for residents. Chief Leonard agreed that he is uncomfortable with calling this meeting a "public hearing". We are trying to take the wishes of the neighbors into account and would like their input. Chief Leonard is guessing that the neighbors will agree with the compromise of taking down some of the stop signs. Ron mentioned that the reverse 911 system could be used to notify residents of the meeting.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED to refer to ENGINEERING to put together a few different scenarios which will be discussed further at the September meeting.

3a. Municipal off street parking regulation.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED: To TABLE.

3b. High School parking regulations.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED: To TABLE.

3d) Traffic Commission rules and regulations update.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED:

To TABLE until the Commission can determine how to handle this project.

3e) Communication from Kevin Flynn, re: Grant of Authority to enforce traffic regulations at CDA (Community Development Authority) senior housing locations.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED:

To TABLE

3f. Request for protected left turn signal for eastbound traffic on Lincoln St. @ **Bolton St.**

Tim Collins presented a revised timing sequence for the traffic lights at this location. The new sequence would allow for a protected left turn with a 7 second advance green arrow. It is believed that this would help to clear the line of traffic. At least the first few vehicles would be able to take the protected left turn if necessary. There would still be 28 seconds for both directions to have a "green ball".

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED to APPROVE the new timing sequence as described in the diagram.

3g. Review of nighttime commercial exclusion on Stevens Street.

Tim Collins presented a detailed map/diagram indicating a "preferred" truck route. The intent is to provide additional signage that will more clearly define the truck route and hopefully divert the traffic from Stevens Street. There is currently a sign by Clinton Street encouraging commercial vehicles to "Keep Left". He is suggesting that another sign be placed down near Monnicks so that commercial vehicles would be alerted sooner that they should be merging left. Chief Leonard agreed that this would be helpful but asked if stronger language could be used on the sign, i.e. "All Commercial Vehicles Keep Left". Tim said that we really can't say "all trucks" because that is the regulation for a truck exclusion and trucks are not excluded from Lincoln Street. We are just trying to find the best way to strongly suggest the "preferred route". Tim also noted that there is currently a huge tree blocking another sign on the route. The sign needs to be moved so that it is clearly visible.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED to refer back to ENGINEERING as Ron would like to discuss "advisory signs" in more detail and will report back at the next meeting.

That there being no further business of the Traffic Commission held on this date, meeting adjourned at 11:20 a.m.

Traffic Commission

The Regular Meeting of the Traffic Commission was held on Tuesday, September 28, 2010 at 10:05 a.m. in City Council Committee Room, City Hall. Members present: Chairman Police Chief Mark Leonard, Vice Chairman – DPW Commissioner Ronald LaFreniere and Fire Chief Ricky Plummer. Also present: City Engineer Thomas Cullen, Asst. Civil Engineer Tim Collins and City Councilor Rob Tunnera. Minutes taken by: Karen Lambert, MPD Records Clerk.

1- Minutes

The minutes of the Traffic Commission meeting of Tuesday, August 31st, 2010.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED: To APPROVE.

2-New Business

2a. Communication from Patricia Pazzaneze, re: speed limit on Donald Lynch Blvd.

Ms. Pazzaneze is concerned about the new posted speed limit of 40 mph near the New England Sports Center. She is especially concerned about the day care center and hotel in the area and the heavily traveled crosswalk in front of the NESC. She has suggested that a speed limit of 30 mph would be much more appropriate. Chief Leonard advised that we had looked into this issue before and had made a request to the MHD to reduce the speed limit here. The only reduction they agreed to was in an area up by the Mall. He suggested possible advisory signage.

Ron LaFreniere went on to explain (mainly for the benefit of Councilor Tunnera) that when you see a white sign for a posted regulated speed zone it requires a vote of the traffic commission based on engineering criteria. It relates to the speed that 85% of vehicles travel, this or greater. After the speed zone is established there may be circumstances within the zone that change the situation, i.e. curvature of the roadway. This is where advisory signage could be placed. This type of sign is yellow and could state a different speed than the established speed zone. The problem is that this appears to (and does) conflict with the speed in the designated speed zone. Chief Leonard also commented that the reduced speed is difficult to enforce. We've gone down this road



before and even if another study is done, the DOT has to approve it. He mentioned that the Speed Board has been out there several times.

Ron commented that he does not like advisory signage but it may be needed here due to the concern with pedestrians in the area. He called it "an accident waiting to happen." Chief Leonard asked what speed Ron would suggest. He feels that 30 mph would be reasonable.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED to refer to ENGINEERING:

- 1) To review advisory signage and determine if additional warning signs are necessary.
- 2) Locate the prior speed study for review. Findings to be discussed at next meeting.

2b. Monument Ave./Water St. intersection parking concerns.

Chief Leonard received an e-mail from one of his Lieutenants with regard to this issue. The school bus driver for this location has difficulty making the turn here because vehicles are parked too close to the intersection. The problem mainly appears to involve one specific vehicle. Chief Leonard said that he has not specifically looked into this situation yet but it appears to involve 1) enforcement and 2) possible signage, i.e. "no parking here to corner". The issue with the one particular vehicle may have already been addressed by an officer.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED to refer to the POLICE STATION for enforcement.

3-Old Business

3g) Pleasant Street parking restrictions between Chestnut St. and Elm St.

Chief Leonard presented the revised regulation that would DELETE the 30 minute parking restriction on the West Side of Pleasant Street from Chestnut St. northerly to the property line at 118 Elm St.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED to APPROVE the amended regulation.

3a. Municipal off street parking regulation.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED: To TABLE.

3b. High School parking regulations.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED: To TABLE.

3d. Traffic Commission rules and regulations update.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED:

To TABLE until the Commission can determine how to handle this project.

3e. Communication from Kevin Flynn, re: Grant of Authority to enforce traffic regulations at CDA (Community Development Authority) senior housing locations.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED: To TABLE

. 3g. Review of nighttime commercial exclusion on Stevens Street.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED:
To TABLE

NOTE - DPW Commissioner Ron LaFreniere left the meeting at this time. He will review the following agenda item with Engineering prior to the next meeting.

3c. Stop signs on Bigelow Street.

Engineering put together 3 potential alternatives for this location and they were presented, in brief, by Tim Collins. It was further discussed that there would be an informational meeting in the evening, at a later date, to provide the opportunity for public input. Tim explained that Engineering cannot recommend keeping the stop signs since we now know that they do not meet the required warrants.

<u>Alternative 1 - The only possible warrant that could be brought into question is the one</u> dealing with pedestrian traffic. In order to meet the requirements for this warrant, sidewalks would need to be installed along the full length of Bigelow. The road is wide enough for sidewalks (on one side); however, the pavement would need to be altered to make room. The estimated cost would be \$500,000.

Alternative 2 – The adding of signalization at the intersection of Bigelow and Donald Lynch with a limited green arrow (short time period) for turning onto Bigelow. This would be similar to the intersection of East Main and Curtis. This would potentially cause traffic to backup and would encourage drivers to seek alternative routes. The estimated cost would be \$100,000.

Alternative 3 - Make Bigelow Street one way, (however, this would create a "hardship" for residents) or a portion of it one way. The attempt would be to stop traffic from using Bigelow as a way to leave the Mall area. It would involve creating a cul-de-sac where drivers could turn around and go the other way and advance warning signs, i.e. Road ends use turn around.

Chief Leonard said that he had a hard time "embracing any of these alternatives". Tim commented that any time you create a calming pattern it will disrupt traffic elsewhere. The Chief noted that the initial goal of the stop signs was to deter traffic from traveling down Bigelow St. when traveling to the Mall and NESC. The stop signs are no longer working as a deterrent because of GPS. Traffic is now continually sent down Bigelow. Prior to the mall and other development, there was hardly any traffic on Bigelow. It was



basically a residential street. "Overnight", this road saw a huge increase in traffic. It is the Chief's sense that over the years, the residents of Bigelow St. have accepted the stop signs. The only reason we have now revisited this issue is because the Traffic Commission received a formal request to do so.

Tim commented that when he was out doing the traffic study, the opinion of residents seemed to be "half and half", i.e. half wanted the stop signs down and half did not. Chief Leonard said that he would like to know why people either want or don't want them. Are we talking about a speed issue or a traffic volume issue? If we are trying to make the roadway safer, should we take the signs down but install speed bumps, for example, to slow traffic. Engineering made the comment that speed bumps are not good for young drivers or motorcycles. Are there other alternatives? They commented that on Beach Street, the roadway was narrowed to force traffic to slow.

Chief Leonard said that he was hoping to see an alternative that included taking some of the stop signs down. He is hoping to find a "happy medium". Of all the alternatives presented, the most appealing is creating sidewalks, which would include crosswalks where pedestrians could safely cross, at the stop signs, from one subdivision to another. However, only installing crosswalks on a portion of the street, i.e. Shea to Evalina, would allow for some of the stop signs to be maintained while also providing a benefit to residents. The big question here is money. It would require a long range plan. In the meantime, some signs could be taken down. Another study could be done in two years to see if there has been a change in the traffic flow. We could then compare and see if the stop signs actually did deter traffic. Chief Leonard did also note that he would like to see the intersection of Donald Lynch and Bigelow signalized.

It was further discussed that Engineering would "tweek" the sidewalk plan with the idea of taking a few signs down for the next meeting. This appears to be a decent compromise: A) Take some down. B) Do another study at a later date. C) Work on funding.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED: To refer to ENGINERRING to work on the plan as outlined above and continue the discussion at the next meeting in October.

That there being no further business of the Traffic Commission held on this date, meeting adjourned at 11:10 a.m.

CHAIRS BUSINESS

Blackhorse Farms/Carisbrooke II

Mr. Fay stated that the Planning Board has been very patient and accommodating to the developers of Blackhorse Farms/Carisbrooke It. However, since August 23, 2010, no response has been received by the Planning Board regarding the City Engineer's report concerning conditions related to the streets and ways of the subdivision requiring attention prior to recommending an extension of the subdivision approval.
