We have received pricing to perform the water main replacement on Bolton Street that was originally funded as part of the FY07 CAPITAL BOND package.

In an effort to address recent concerns about lead levels in our drinking water, the department is requesting your consideration to provide additional funding for this project in order to replace all lead services that currently exist within the Bolton Street right-of-way. This was not originally contemplated when the original project was conceived and estimated nor was the cost to install temporary by-pass lines now required to complete the project.

The additional cost for this project amounts to \$496,000 over and above the original estimated cost of \$235,000 for a total project cost of \$731,000. As you may recall, the city received low interest loan funding for this project through the MWRA's Local Pipeline Assistance Program.

Inasmuch as we are starting to near the end of this year's construction season, we ask for your immediate consideration of this request, otherwise we will be faced with deferring the work until next year. Given the anticipated resurfacing of this roadway next spring, the preferred alternative is to complete the utility work before the onset of winter.

In August 2008, the City Council approved an amendment to the procedures for processing claims against the City (Order No. 08-1001787A). More specifically, the amendment provided not only an expedited method for claims alleging damage to residential mailboxes caused by the operation of snow plows, but also a means for assisting claimants whose claims against the City were denied because private contractors had been deemed the responsible party.

The August 2008 amendment contained a sunset provision stipulating that the amendment would expire on June 30, 2009 "unless prior to expiration the City Council determines it is appropriate to extend this amendment beyond June 30, 2009." Although the Council did not act prior to that date to extend the amendment, I am proposing that the ordinance be renewed at this time. If the Council approves that renewal, the claims procedures would be in place in time for the 2009-2010 winter season.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARLBOROUGH THAT THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MARLBOROUGH, AS AMENDED, BE FURTHER AMENDED BY ADDDING TO SECTION 7-13 OF CHAPTER 7 OF ARTICLE II THE FOLLOWING NEW PARAGRAPHS:

It shall be deemed to be within the proper discharge of the official duties of the employees in the Legal Department for said employees to contact private contractors and/or their insurers in an effort to assist, or attempt to assist, those claimants whose claims against the City of Marlborough have been denied based upon a determination by the Legal Department or the City's insurer that said private contractors are responsible for satisfying those claimants' claims; provided however, that nothing contained herein shall be construed to create an attorney-client relationship between any claimant so assisted, or attempted to be assisted, and either the Solicitor or the Assistant Solicitor, whose sole client is and shall remain the City of Marlborough; and provided, further, that nothing contained herein shall be construed so as to interfere, in the sole determination of the Solicitor or the Assistant Solicitor, with the proper discharge of any other official duties of the employees in the Legal Department. This paragraph shall be applicable to only those claims accruing on or after November 1, 2009.

Notwithstanding the immediately preceding paragraph, any written claim presented to the City of Marlborough alleging that a residential mailbox has been damaged by the operation of a snow plow shall be granted upon written confirmation provided by the Department of Public Works to the Legal Department that City of Marlborough snow plow operations were in effect during the date when, and on the street where, the claimed mailbox damage occurred; provided, however, that such claim must be accompanied both by an auto-dated photograph(s) of the damaged mailbox as well as by a paid receipt showing the actual cost of the mailbox's repair or replacement; and provided, further, the maximum amount of reimbursement shall be set at Seventy-Five and 00/100 (\$75.00) Dollars, except that in the absence of such photograph(s) and/or such paid receipt, the maximum amount of reimbursement shall be set at Thirty and 00/100 (\$30.00) Dollars. This paragraph shall be applicable to only those mailbox claims accruing on or after November 1, 2009.

The foregoing amendment to Section 7-13 of Chapter 7 of Article II of the Code of the City of Marlborough, as amended, shall expire on June 30, 2010 unless prior to expiration the City Council determines it is appropriate to extend this amendment beyond June 30, 2010.

Honorable President Vigeant and Councilors:

Enclosed is an order deleting section 7-33 of the City Code, which concerns the rate of pay for the services of the Tree Warden and Moth Superintendent, and amends the City Code to provide a comprehensive ordinance concerning the position of Tree Warden. In the past, the positions of Tree Warden and Moth Superintendent have been merged into a single position known as "Tree Warden" which has been governed, with the exception of section 7-33 of the 2008 Code, by the Massachusetts General Laws. The attached order continues the City's past practice of merging the two positions into the single position of Tree Warden, but it also accomplishes several other objectives of the Massachusetts General Laws.

These objectives include (1) updating requirements for the position formerly known as the "Moth Superintendent", which is now known under the Massachusetts General Laws as "Superintendent of Tree Management And Pest Control"; (2) correlating requirements for experience and certification with those required under Massachusetts General Laws; and (3) requiring written permission from the City department with care, custody, and control over city-owned property before the Tree Warden performs duties on that property.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARLBOROUGH THAT THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MARLBOROUGH, AS AMENDED, BE FURTHER AMENDED BY DELETING §7-33 OF CHAPTER 7 IN ITS ENTIRETY, AND INSERTING IN ITS PLACE THE FOLLOWING:

§7-33. Tree Warden.

- A. Pursuant to the provisions of M.G.L. c. 41, §106, there shall be a "Tree Warden," who shall be appointed for a term of three (3) years by the Mayor subject to confirmation of the City Council.
- B. The Tree Warden shall be the officer charged with the care of public shade trees with all of the powers and duties conferred and imposed on tree wardens under M.G.L. c. 41, §106 and M.G.L. c. 87, as provided under M.G.L. c. 87, §13, and with all of the powers and duties of the superintendent of shade tree management and pest control as provided under M.G.L. c. 132, §13. The Tree Warden shall report directly to the Commissioner of the Department of Public Works.
- C. The Tree Warden shall be qualified to carry out the powers and duties of the position by experience and training in arboriculture and licensed to use pesticides in accordance with M.G.L. c. 41, §106 and M.G.L. c. 132, §13.
- D. Any person requiring the services of the Tree Warden shall pay for such services at an hourly rate equal to the hourly rate of the general foreman of the Forestry, Parks & Cemetery Division of the Department of Public Works. Such compensation shall be paid directly to the Tree Warden.
- E. The Tree Warden must obtain prior written authorization to perform services on City-owned property from the City department with care, custody, and control of the particular City property.

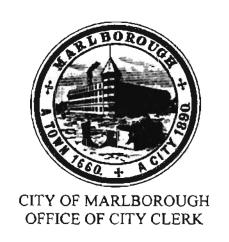

Section 40I of Chapter 7 requires that the Division of Capital Asset Management and Maintenance ("DCAM") notify the mayor, city council, regional planning agency and local legislators at least one hundred twenty (120) days prior to any transfer or significant change in use of one (1) or more acres of real property owned by the Commonwealth which is located within these agencies' jurisdiction. The notice is informational and you are not required to take any action. The notice period may be reduced if the local public officials and legislators agree.

Pursuant to said Section 40I, I am writing to inform you that DCAM proposes to transfer, as authorized by Chapter 7 and significantly change the use of, approximately fifty four and four tenths (54.4) acres, more or less, of surplus state-owned highway land located on the west side of Pleasant Street and southerly off of Route 85 Connector Road in the city of Marlborough (the "Premises"). The Premises shall be transferred to the Department of Fish and Game.

The Premises are a portion of the Route 85 Connector Road and Route I-290 Interchange Layouts under the care and control of the Massachusetts Department of Highways (MHD). The proposed use of the Premises is for open space/wildlife management purposes and the protection of the headwaters for the Flagg Brook watershed.

The MHD has declared the Premises surplus to current and foreseeable state highway needs.

I am requesting that your agency agree to reduce the one hundred and twenty (120) day notification period to sixty (60) days from the date of this notice to permit DCAM to proceed with the disposition of the Premises in an expeditious manner.

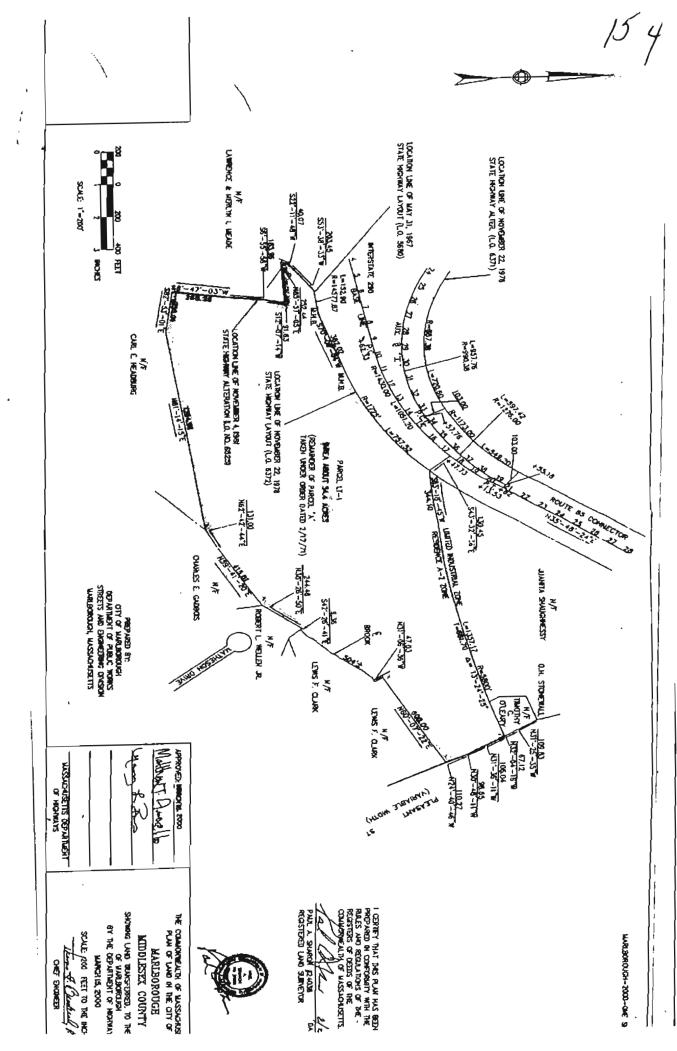

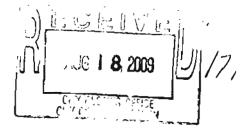

Traffic Commission

The Regular Meeting of the Traffic Commission was held on Tuesday, July 28, 2009 at 10:05 a.m. in City Council Committee Room, City Hall. Members present: Chairman Police Chief Mark Leonard, Vice Chairman – DPW Commissioner Ronald LaFreniere, City Clerk Lisa M. Thomas, City Planner Nancy Savoie. Also present: Timothy Collins, Engineering Division, City Council President Arthur G. Vigeant, Minutes taken by: Karen Lambert, MPD Records Clerk.

1- Minutes

That the minutes of the Traffic Commission meeting of Tuesday, June 30, 2009. MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED:

To APPROVE.

2-New Business

2a. Communication from Jim Joubert, Re: Stop signs on Bigelow Street

Ron LaFreniere explained that stop signs, in general, require that certain warrants be met before they can be put into place. These warrants are federal standards that are consistent across the country. One of the major warrants for a stop sign is traffic counts. Mr. Joubert is questioning whether the warrants were met at the time the stop signs were installed. This particular stretch of road has 5 separate intersections controlled by stop signs. Chief Leonard stated that the installation of these stop signs pre-dates most of the members of this Commission. It was an issue that came up as a result of the increased traffic due to the Mall. The group went on to discuss the fact that the issue should be readdressed and a new traffic count conducted.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED to REFER to Engineering to do traffic counts and compile historical data.

To APPROVE.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED to suspend the rules and bring up item 3g.-Old Business as Councilor Vigeant was in attendance for this item.

3g. Crosswalk @ Artist's Lofts on Lincoln Street.

Chief Leonard summarized the various discussions with Deborah Fairbanks regarding the crosswalk location. The installation of a crosswalk was included as a condition of the initial Site Plan; however, discussions have gone back and forth as to the best location for the crosswalk. Members looked at the Site Plan which included the requirements for a handicapped accessible crosswalk further down the street. Initially, the intent was to make the crosswalk meet ADA standards. Chief Leonard's personal view is that if the location for the crosswalk is shifted further down the street, (away from the parking lot) to meet ADA requirements, people may not actually walk down the street to use it. Counselor Vigeant agreed that the crosswalk needs to be convenient to the parking lot. He noted that there are other crosswalks in the City that don't meet ADA requirements, for example, the one right down the street at the Collins Funeral Home. Ron LaFreniere said that the real question is whether the City is actually required to meet all ADA requirements. His read is that we don't need to comply with all these regulations simply for a crosswalk. He does not see anything in the law that says we can't put the crosswalk close to where Deborah Fairbanks has requested. We have the ability to locate it where it will be used, i.e. very close to the driveway, though not in the driveway. Chief Leonard advised that the goal of the Loft project was to revitalize the area and that the sidewalk issue needs to be addressed, the sooner the better. He is in agreement with moving forward.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED to REFER to Engineering for Regulations and to the DPW for implementation.

2 - New Business (continued)

2b. Communication from Councilor Seymour, re: speed limit signs on Russell Street.

Ron LaFreniere stated that a sign appears to be missing. Tim Collins commented that the existing sign is right at the intersection of Pleasant and Russell and that there is no sign at the intersection at Mechanic Street. It is a thickly settled zone with a 30 mph speed limit.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED to refer to the DPW, as necessary, to replace, move and/or review for further consideration for additional signs in the corridor. TO APPROVE.

2c. Communication from Councilor Clancy, re: Request for hidden driveway sign at 369 Stevens Street.

Ron LaFreniere advised that, in general, the City does not put up hidden driveway signs. The City normally installs signs that benefit the motoring public - unless there is a legitimate public safety concern. Tim Collins advised that more speed limit signs will be going up in this area to accommodate the School Zone. This should slow traffic. Ron also advised that roadside vegetation cutting may not have been completed yet.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED to refer to Engineering. To APPROVE.

3-Old Business

3a. Long term oversized vehicle ordinance.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED: To TABLE.

3b. Municipal off street parking regulation.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED: To TABLE.

3c. High School parking regulations.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED: To TABLE

3d. Communication from Barbara McGann, re: Request for school zone on Forest St. near AMSA Charter School.

Chief Leonard will be meeting with the Engineers (from the City and the Property) to discuss the traffic situation at this location.

Ron LaFreniere went on to briefly discuss the proposed reconstruction project for Forest Street. The City is moving forward with the design process; however, the potential project would be very expensive and may not end up being feasible for the City.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED:

To TABLE until further information is available.

3e. Request for "School Zone" at Richer School.

Tim again showed the diagram of the area indicating the proposed school zone along with his memo of 6/11/09, outlining the specifics. (Not all members were present at the last meeting.) Chief Leonard had prepared the Regulations to establish the new school zone along with an Emergency Preamble.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED:

To APPROVE the Emergency Preamble.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED:

To APPROVE the designated School Zone at Richer School. Lisa Thomas to advertize immediately.

3g. Communication from Kenneth Almeida, re: Four way stop request – Porter Rd. @ Pippen Rd.

Tim Collins advised that the Commission was going to wait until school is in session to obtain accurate traffic counts in this area.

MOTION was made, seconded, duly VOTED: To TABLE.
