ORDERED: Minutes, City Council meeting, June 25, 2007, **FILE**; adopted.

ORDERED: City Council President Arthur Vigeant introduced to the Public, the new Library Director, Salvatore Genovese; adopted.

ORDERED: That the appointment of Laurie Fitzgerald to the Historical Commission be and is herewith refer to **PERSONNEL COMMITTEE**; adopted.

ORDERED: That the Marlborough Police Department has been awarded a Bulletproof Vest Reimbursement Grant from the Department of Justice in the amount of \$23,702.00. The Grant will be used to purchase bulletproof vests for members of the Police Department, **APPROVE**; adopted.

ORDERED: That the Marlborough Police Department has been awarded a Bulletproof Vest Reimbursement Grant from the Executive Office of Public Safety in the amount of \$20,250.00. The Grant will be used to purchase bulletproof vests for members of the Police Department, **APPROVE**; adopted.

- ORDERED: That the Human Services Department has been awarded a grant in the amount of \$43,000 from the Metro/South West Regional Employment Board. - ORDERED: That the Council on Aging has been awarded the Marlborough Council on Aging Formula Grant for FY08 from the State of Massachusetts. The Council on Aging of Marlborough has been appropriated a grant in the amount of \$34,430.00 for the fiscal year FY08 as a supplement to our City Budget, **APPROVE**; adopted. Currently, the City of Marlborough is a member of the Worcester Regional Transit Authority which administers our AVCOA paratransit for the City's disabled and senior populations. In order to move to the MetroWest RTA, a municipal vote to withdraw from the Worcester RTA will be required as part of next November election process reported from Transportation Committee.

Suspension of the Rules requested to add two communications into the records and also agenda items #14 and #15 – granted; adopted

ORDERED: That the City Council **APPROVE** the proposal for the purchase of the Olde Fire Station by WRT Management Corp. in the amount of \$850,000.00 with WRT's agreement not to request a TIF agreement for the property from the City of Marlborough and the granting of easements by WRT to the City of Marlborough for the staircases (2) on Bolton and Main Street adjacent to the property; adopted.

The acceptance of the offer of WRT Management Corp to acquire the former Fire Station at 91 Main Street in Marlborough is subject to the condition that the deed from the City include restrictions containing the following language:

"The following deed restrictions shall run with the deeded premises and shall be expressly included in any lease pertaining to said premises:

- 1) In the event that a restaurant, any entity serving alcoholic beverages of any kind to the public, and/or any entity providing entertainment of any kind to the public, is operating at the premises, then:
- a) the serving of said alcoholic beverages, and the providing of said entertainment, shall be prohibited at said premises after 12:00 midnight on any day when said premises is open for operation;
- b) appropriate ventilation shall be installed so as, in the opinion of the Marlborough Board of Health, to minimize any restaurant odors at neighboring properties to the greatest extent possible on any day when said restaurant is open for operation.
- 2) The exterior façade of the existing building, including brickwork, original lighting, entry-way doors (including garage bay doors) and windows, shall be retained as identical as possible to the building's finished condition as previously proposed by Grantor. Any exterior changes proposed by Grantee shall be subject to review and written approval by the Mayor of the City of Marlborough or by the Mayor's authorized designee. Grantee acknowledges that Grantee is aware that the building is within the Marlborough Center Historic District, a historic district on the National Register of Historic Places,"

Councilor Schafer proposed the amendment to add the two conditions to the order, **APPROVE**; adopted.

Councilor Juaire proposed an amendment to condition #2 that the Historical Commission, instead of the Mayor, approve any exterior changes proposed by the Grantee.

Suspension of the rules requested to allow the City Solicitor speak – granted.

Councilor Webster excused herself from this discussion. Councilor Juaire withdrew the amendment.

Councilor Juaire opposed the sale of the Fire Station.

- ORDERED: That the "Loan Order for the Westerly Treatment Plant Upgrades \$41,100,000." to upgrade the Westerly Treatment plant. The Mayor presented the timeline for the project as follows final design complete by second quarter 2008 and construction to begin on June 30, 2008 and complete in 2 years, refer back to the FINANCE COMMITTEE; adopted
- ORDERED: That the appointment of Diane Smith as City Auditor, **APPROVE** as recommended by the Personnel Committee; adopted
- ORDERED: That there being no further business, the regular meeting of the City Council is herewith adjourned at 9:15 p.m., **FILE**; adopted.
