119 Winthrop Street:

At the last meeting, the Board of Health wanted the Health Agent to follow-up and seek information regarding 119 Winthrop Street. It was communicated that this was a private resident. There was leak in the oil tank. The problem has been resolved. A licensed site professional was hired. There was a leak in the oil tank.

SAFE Coalition:

The Support for Addicts and Families by Empowerment (SAFE) group, a substance-abuse coalition located in the Franklin-Medway-Milford area, will host two events in February in an effort to better inform the public about the factors that lead to opioid abuse.

The SAFE group will be hosting a talk by Harvard University Professor Robert Putnam on Feb. 2 at 7:00 PM at Franklin High School, 218 Oak St, Franklin, MA. According to Rep. Jeff Roy, the Putnam talk is not solely about drugs, "It's going to be more about the sociological background and context of the opioid crisis." "Dr. Putnam has done a lot of research - not on opioids specifically - and he does paint a good picture of what is happening in America at the same time this epidemic has exploded."

Roy said the theme to Putnam's work - which includes the books "Bowling Alone" and "Our Kids: The American Dream in Crisis" - is a breakdown in community structures and the effect it has had on the country's children."

After the presentation, Roy said, Franklin School Committee member Anne Bergen is slated to sit down with Putnam for a one-on-one, question-and-answer session.

Audience members will be able to write their questions on cards to be answered by Professor Putnam and Anne Bergen.

CHRIS HERREN talk:

Chris Herren, will be giving three talks in Franklin on Feb. 29, two with Franklin students during the school day and a public talk that evening at the 7 p.m. coalition meeting at the high school located at 218 Oak St, Franklin, MA. Herren has spoken at several venues throughout the area, including a similar event last year at Medway schools and community. He discusses how substance-abuse issues derailed his life and about his recovery.

Animal Regulations:

The Health Agent communicated that she has a copy of the animal regulations as requested from the last meeting.

Tobacco Regulations:

The Board of Health agent was able to gather a copy of the tobacco regulations. The members will be checking to make sure the most recent copy is uploaded onto the town website.
