## **Choate Park/Middle School/Oakland Field rehab**

\$450,000

By agreeing to transfer these funds, the Town and the Board of Selectman agree that CPC will retain final approval of all documents as well as all public hearings. The Board of Selectman agree to put in place a steering committee that will hold the public meetings and make sure that all interests groups be invited and included in all discussions.

#### **Concerns:**

Amount is high although it includes all 4 projects designs and specs CPC can till stop project if it does not meet the needs of the town

### **Motion:**

The Community Preservation Committee recommendations the transfer of \$450,000 for the purpose of funding design and engineering services and the preparation of public bid documents for the purpose of making improvements, including accessibility enhancements to recreational facilities at Choate Park, the Medway middle School, Cassidy Fields, and Oakland Park. The Town also agrees to the creation of a Steering Committee tasked with list outlined in a memo from the Town Administrator Michael Boynton to the Board of Selectman dated April 13, 2016. It is also agreed that The Community Preservation Community will be provided for review and approval all conceptual drawings prior to preparation of construction documents.

#### **Discussion on Motion:**

Steering Committee;

Will be made up of residents of different groups and will work thru design and bid docs only. EFRAC will take the lead on this project.

All bills will be approved by The Community Preservation Committee.

Amount of Money:

Does not seem to be based upon a reasonable design
