At 6:33 Brian Humes began his Fit presentation on Canal/Howe Property. Fit Plan is attached to the minutes. Looking at this first plan there were a lot of questions concerning the layout which the members of the board said it was backwards and the # of stories of the building, the shared space, the curb appeal. So after questions we asked Brian to go back and do a fit study on Canal/Howe with the buildings the other way and separate as a complex and on 24-26 Providence Street as a full building. The fire department members spoke of not having bays to drive through which would allow an option for more space on the properties. Brian and the committee decided to have a meeting on February 24, 2015 to go over these fit studies. Brian left the meeting and Dan Daly asked where the sewer lines come into the properties? Jayne will check with Mr. McNeil and get back the answer for the next meeting.



Baril Oil
10 Howe Avenue

License issued in 1971 for the storage of 20,500 gallons of flammable/combustibles.

- (2) 10,000 gallon aboveground tanks used to store heating oil
- (1) 500-gallon aboveground tank used to store heating oil

The tanks were removed in March, 2004 by LaMountain Brothers. They notified DEP at that time of a "release" on the property and the presence of oil and hazardous materials. DEP issued a "Notice of Responsibility" in April, 2004. LaMountain filed a Release Abatement Measure Plan that involved excavation, management, and off-site recycling of up to 500 cubic yards of oil-contaminated soil. A follow-up report was to be filed with DEP, but no other information is in the file.

A permit was issued in 1992 for the storage of liquid propane gas. A 500-gallon tank and pump station was installed in August, 1992. No information is available in the file indicating when this tank was removed.

The license was revoked in October, 2003.

The building was demolished in March, 2004.
