ITEM TWO - DISCUSSION/ PUBLIC ATTENDEES

Nick Repekta of 1 Hayward Glen Dr. was present to request an abatement of his sewer use bill. His request is one of the abatement requests before the Commission this evening for consideration. The Comm. reviewed his request. Lisa Allain motioned to approve abatement in the amount of \$764.94; Happy Erickson seconded; a unanimous vote of approval was obtained.

Mr. Repekta also voiced his concern about just recently receiving a bill for the \$5,000.00 betterment charge – one year after he purchased his home. He said the town should've billed him for this earlier than they did.

Re: Revised AOC schedule and Integrated Planning

On August 4, 2016, EPA's Region 1 Office of Environmental Stewardship agreed to a modified schedule for the Upper Blackstone's existing Administrative Order on Consent (AOC) dated May 1, 2014. The agreed upon schedule resulted from many meetings among representatives of the Upper Blackstone, the City of Worcester, EPA and MA DEP during 2016. I believe the following conditions greatly contributed to the parties' ability to come to this agreement:

- The City of Worcester's commitment to submit an Integrated Water Resources Management Plan by February 2019,
- The Upper Blackstone's compliance with the requirements of the AOC to date, and;
- The Upper Blackstone's excellent effluent quality, specifically for total nitrogen and total phosphorus, during the AOC compliance period to date.

Attached to this memo is a report by Worcester DPW&P Commissioner Paul Moosey dated August 29, 2016 which summarizes the recent agreements.

The table on page 2 summarizes the modified Upper Blackstone AOC schedule, as compared to the original schedule. Between 2014 and 2016, the Upper Blackstone has completed numerous studies and reports in accordance with earlier requirements of the AOC. The August 4 schedule modification includes a provision that the dates shown in New Modified Schedule may be revised to be consistent with the Worcester Integrated Plan, if agreed to by all parties.

As part of our annual budgeting process that begins each fall, the Upper Blackstone will summarize historical increases in assessments and will project necessary increases that incorporate compliance with the modified AOC schedule.

Communication Relative to Worcester - EPA Agreement

I am pleased to report that Worcester Department of Public Works and Parks (DPW&P) and Upper Blackstone Water Pollution Abatement District have reached an agreement with EPA Region 1 on a path forward to address infrastructure improvements and environmental obligations while giving full consideration to the City's and ratepayers' fiscal constraints. The agreement is captured in an Administrative Order on Consent signed by the City and EPA on August 4, 2016 and in a modified order for the UBWPAD issued by EPA on the same date.

The agreement requires the City to submit an Integrated Water Resources Management Plan (Integrated Plan) by February 2019. Further, the City must implement its updated Storm Water Management Plan (SWMP) as described in its December 2015 submittal to EPA. These updates consist of modifications to existing sampling and assessment programs and are already being implemented. The City must also provide an annual progress report on its compliance with this agreement. Finally, the City must submit semi-annual progress reports on the implementation of some \$45.5 million of infrastructure improvements and \$28.5 million of upgrades at the UBWPAD planned for completion by 2019. These capital improvements by DPW&P and UBWPAD are already included in capital projects budgets and do not constitute additional mandates.

At the heart of this agreement is a commitment by the City to develop an Integrated Plan by February 2019. To address a national outcry from municipalities about the crippling costs of Clean Water Act compliance, EPA Headquarters issued a framework for integrated planning. This framework was used by DPW&P to create a draft conceptual Integrated Plan which was presented to EPA Region 1 in November of 2015.

The key components of integrated planning are:

 The municipality establishes an annual spending level for water, wastewater and stormwater infrastructure improvements and



environmental obligations that is affordable for the community. This spending cap will vary by community and considers the full breadth of municipal costs and revenues and the ability of all levels of ratepayer to pay.

- The municipality prioritizes infrastructure and environmental projects to achieve maximum benefit for each dollar spent. Lower priority projects may be deferred for implementation at a later date. Priorities are to be reevaluated periodically and implementation schedules will be adjusted accordingly. It is expected that completion of all projects and improvements will occur over a span of fifty years or more.
- The public, including all local stakeholders, is to be included in plan development and weigh in on priorities.

The integrated plan being developed by DPW&P will address wastewater and stormwater systems including:

- Wastewater collection system
- Combined sewer system
- Quinsigamond Ave Combined Sewer Overflow Treatment Facility (QCSOTF)
- Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4)
- Water Filtration Plant Filter Backwash
- Upper Blackstone Water Pollution Abatement District wastewater treatment plant
- Green Island neighborhood flooding

The integrated plan will also encompass four (4) National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permits, including the Upper Blackstone wastewater treatment plant, QCSOTF, MS4 and Filtration Plant filter backwash. In addition, the integrated plan will address 14 impaired receiving waters and 8 water bodies with phosphorus loading limits.

It should be noted that creating an integrated plan in two and one-half (2-1/2) years is a daunting task. Nationally, integrated plans done elsewhere have typically been five (5) year efforts and those plans tended to have a much more limited scope than the Worcester plan being envisioned. Worcester does have an advantage in that the draft conceptual integrated plan already lays out the basic framework for the final plan. The remaining work to be done is: identifying what other studies need to be completed; creating a process for prioritizing projects; determining a mechanism for estimating environmental improvements; and identifying and prioritizing projects. Development of the integrated plan will itself be a significant and costly endeavor requiring the services of specialized consultants along with considerable staff time.

It cannot be overstated and must be made absolutely clear that the integrated planning approach being pursued by DPW&P is a logical and common sense path forward but it does not eliminate costs and rate hikes in the near and distant future. Rather, integrated planning commits the City to a planned agreed upon annual spending level. As federal and state financial assistance for water infrastructure remains limited to low interest loans and occasional small, targeted grants, Worcester's water and sewer ratepayers will continue to carry the funding burden. The difference between the current approach and integrated planning is that integrated planning allows spending to be limited by local affordability and directs local dollars first to those projects that

produce the maximum community benefit while those with lesser or questionable benefit can be deferred to the future. The current approach mandates compliance with permit requirements with little concern for costs and puts permit issues above all other needs.

For more than a decade, Worcester DPW&P and EPA Region 1 have been at odds over NPDES permits and Clean Water Act mandates. With compliance costs estimated to exceed \$1 billion and the likelihood of achieving Clean Water Act goals considered to be remote, the Agency and the City have remained at loggerheads. A concerted, collaborative effort by both sides to find a way forward has resulted in this apparent breakthrough. While integrated planning is not viewed as a panacea, it is considered an opportunity to advance environmental improvements in a fiscally responsible way. There certainly may be differences of opinion between EPA and the City as the plan is developed and implemented, but this collaborative process should allow for less contentious outcomes and may establish this effort as a national model.

I will provide you and the City Council updates as work progresses on this critical effort.






