Re: Millis Board of Health, FY 2013 Budget

Attached please find the following information for your use in determining a recommendation on the Millis Board of Health (BOH) FY 2013 budget:

- FY 2013 Board of Health Budget and forms.
- South Norfolk County Arc, report letter November 16, 2011.

The FY2013 budget presented represents our needs in order to provide services for Fiscal 2013 and the needs to meet the increased requirements of the Board and Department. Areas in where increases are requested:

<u>Public Health Nursing Hours</u>: The Millis Health Department, with volunteer assistance, conducted the seasonal flu clinics with additional doses provided in the office with extended nurse hours. Although this has been a mild flu year, the nurse has had to coordinate additional paperwork for increased reimbursement from insurance companies, as the Town purchased flu vaccine to meet the community need. The future seasonal flu immunization program needs will increase, as the State allotment of vaccines decreases, focus may become office clinics where the additional hours will be primarily used during the flu season. The nurse has completed the required training and begun utilization of MAVEN for Communicable Disease reporting system, additional required reporting is anticipated. Thus maintaining a minimum number of additional hours over the base salary allows for needed flexibility in the position and also will allow her participation with the Millis LEPC.

<u>Clerical Hours:</u> As requested in the past budgets, the implementation of the town wide MUNIS Permitting Tracking System and Business Licensing program in 2011 has require additional employee time. Training was done amidst the BOH year and will continue to require additional time for proper implementation of the program. An additional two hours per week (2 hours) is requested to assist in the continued development within the Board of Health. As Board of Health minutes are being requested to be posted on-line, care as to their format will be reviewed prior to their posting.

The Board of Health proposes to utilize portions of outside funding: Medicare flu vaccination re-imbursement; portions of the Food Establishment fees to fund the Consulting Food Inspector services; an annual Rabies Clinic; and all other permits and plan reviews. The Board of Health office has received a small grant funding amounts from the Department of Public Helath for emergency preparedness.

Dear Mr. Moles:

On behalf of the individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities, including autism and their families who reside in Millis, the South Norfolk County ARC wishes to thank you for your support over the many years of our partnership. With your support combined with that of our other 11 local towns, SNCARC has been successfully "turning disabilities into possibilities" since its inception in 1954. Created then and governed today by several hundred local families with children with intellectual and developmental disabilities including autism, SNCARC is a self-help, grass roots organization responsible to local needs. This coalition of local families and friends are the heart, conscience and the voice for those who cannot help or speak for themselves.

As a home-grown, non-profit organization, we have always been accountable to, and dependent on, local financial and volunteer supports. Our job has been to use this platform of local support to advocate for and draw into our communities other public and private resources needed to serve the needs of our neighbors with intellectual and developmental disabilities, including autism.

SNCARC applies these local supports to provide direct care services for the residents of Millis. These services include:

- 1. <u>Family Support and Respite Care Programs</u> which encompass intensive family intervention, in-home Respite Care supports, case management services, emergency supports, clinical services and family training services;
- 2. <u>Family Autism Center</u> which serves individuals with autism and their families with information and referral services, educational services, parent and sibling support groups and a resource library with Internet access.
- 3. <u>Autism and Law Enforcement Coalition (ALEC)</u> which works to foster a deeper understanding of autism and other developmental disabilities among public safety and law enforcement personnel. It provides training for police officers, firefighters, EMT's, and emergency room personnel.

- 4. <u>Day Habilitation Programs</u> which provide educational and rehabilitative day programming for adults who are severely disabled and require specialized and multi-disciplinary care;
- 5. <u>Harbor Counseling Center</u> which provides specialized individual and group mental health care for children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities including autism;
- 6. <u>Social-Recreation Programs</u> which provide after-school and adult social and recreational programs including several social clubs and special events, evening educational classes, discussion groups, summer programs for children and a variety of sports and Special Olympics opportunities.
- 7. Employment Training and Residential Programs which are provided through SNCARC's related-party sister organization, Lifeworks, for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities, including autism.

The support from our local communities has provided the funding base from which we have always operated. This local support, control and accountability well serves local needs in a highly cost efficient manner. Our request from all of our Towns is the same: 65 cents per capita. Last year we were granted \$1,160 from the Town of Millis. We are requesting Level Funding for FY 2013.

By pooling this request with the funding given by the other 11 towns to your local Arc, Millis is able to achieve a cost efficiency which allows it to do more for its developmentally disabled citizens than it could individually.

The total value of all services provided last year to residents of the Town of Millis was \$142,900.
