Tools of the Mind is a researched based instructional program for preschool and kindergarten students. For the past two years, our Kindergarten students have participated in a academic research program. We have seen incredible gains in our students in self-regulation of their social, emotional and cognitive abilities. Funding would allow us to bring this researched based program to our preschoolers. Materials will be bought in FY 14 so that teachers become familiar with them and prepare for implementation.

Funding for Social Studies materials at the elementary level has been lacking for the past seven years. Teachers have developed a comprehensive scope and sequence for grades K-12 addressing the standards outlined in the Massachusetts Curriculum History and Social Science Frameworks. Funding would provide teachers with the materials and tools to teach this curriculum. Funding is needed for the Middle School to supplement the History Alive text with the interactive component. This component will enhance the instruction of Social Studies.

Additional Funding is needed to support the science program. With the implementation of a new literacy program last year, science topics are being presented to students in different grade levels than Millis has traditionally taught those standards. Realigning the current scope and sequence of science units of study to better match the Reading Street program will allow teachers more time to go deeper into the content and connect the science topics to the quality literature being presented to the students. Materials would be grade level appropriate and support life science, physical science, earth science and engineering units at each grade level. In addition, funds are needed to add nonfiction literature to the Middle and High Schools Science curriculum as noted in the MA Common Core Frameworks.

At the start of this project, approximately 8,000 books were more than ten years old. Some of these, however, are novels or literature, which do not become outdated. After the purchases were made during the first phase of this upgrade, there are more than 4,000 books still in need of replacement. Additionally, the district is moving forward on ensuring that all students graduate with the media literacy and 21st century skills needed for a global "knowledge and innovation based" economy which necessitates the inclusion of electronic media for students to access information and literature.

Based on an estimated average cost per book of \$21, the needed updating would require \$84,000. Of this amount, \$15,000 is being requested for FY 14.

To see if the Town will vote to authorize, pursuant to M.G. L. Chapter 44 Section $53E\ 1/2$ the following revolving funds:

- 1. Millis Public Schools Athletic Fields Revolving Fund, said fund to be credited with the receipts from fundraising for construction, renewal and improvement of the athletic fields, including but not limited to structures, equipment such as scoreboards and maintenance of the fields, under the authority of the School Committee, proceeds to be used for improvement of the Millis Public Schools athletic fields, such expenditures not to exceed \$35,000.
- 2. Millis Public Schools Extracurricular Revolving Fund, said fund to be credited with the receipts and donations from school-based extracurricular activities such as, but not limited to Dance, Drama and Arts Performances. Funds will be used for expenses incurred by the extracurricular activities such as, but not limited to, rental of equipment, materials or costumes, purchase of items needed for performances and stipends for extracurricular advisors and instructors, such expenditures not to exceed \$8,000.
