The meeting was brought to order at 7:43 p.m. by Dr. James Lederer, Chair.

The public hearing was opened at 7:44 p.m. by Dr. Lederer, Chair.

Mr. Dan Merrikin, representing the applicant, presented the revised plans (revised April 3, 2018). He stated that the barn and paddock were removed from the plan, and the house shifted backwards to be out of the buffer zone.

The Commission had no further questions.

On a motion made by Ms. Rich, seconded by Mr. Tangerini, it was voted unanimously at 7:46 p.m. to close the public hearing.

On a motion made by Mr. Lee, seconded by Ms. Rich, it was voted unanimously to approve an Order of Conditions, with special conditions, for DEP File #CE225-0412, 72 Farm Street.

### DEP FILE # CE225-0413, NOTICE OF INTENT, PUBLIC HEARING, CONT. 11 ROLLING MEADOW DR. – K. LEVANGIE & M. MCMAHON

The public hearing continuation was opened at 7:48 p.m. by Dr. Lederer, Chair.

Mr. Paul DeSimone, representing the applicant, presented the revised plan (revised March 15, 2018). He stated that the square footage for the addition and the DEP File number approving the wetland line (DEP File #CE225-0407) had been added to the plan. All work is outside of the 50-foot buffer, Mr. DeSimone said. The Commission had no further questions.

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On a motion made by Mr. Lee, seconded by Ms. Rich, it was voted unanimously at 7:49 p.m. to close the public hearing.

On a motion made by Mr. Lee, seconded by Ms. Rich, it was voted unanimously to approve an Order of Conditions, with special conditions, for DEP File #CE225-0413, 11 Rolling Meadow Drive.

## DEP FILE # CE225-0414, NOTICE OF INTENT, PUBLIC HEARING LOTS 5 & 6A/22 ACORN STREET – BANE REALTY TRUST II

The public hearing was opened at 8:00 p.m. by Dr. Lederer, Chair.

Mr. Dan Merrikin, representing the applicant, presented the application and plans. The proposed project is for construction of two single family dwellings on existing lots. According to Mr. Merrikin, the applicant inadvertently cleared into the outer 50' of the buffer zone when preparing to construct the new homes. The homes are outside the buffer zone. Trees were cut and removed, he said, but no stumping was done and the buffer "was not grubbed." As soon as this work was discovered, all work in the buffer was halted and two erosion control lines were installed pending the outcome of this application, he said. There was no alteration of the wetland itself, Mr. Merrikin said. Mr. Fox stated that he had been out of town when this unauthorized work was done, and he apologized. He will re-plant trees to replace the ones taken down if the Commission wishes, he said. Mr. Merrikin will revise the plans to show proposed plantings/landscape notes.

Mr. Merrikin stated that the project consists of the construction of two new single-family dwellings, along with associated driveways, landscaping, and utilities. As shown on the plans, the proposed work includes activities in the buffer zone associated with the landscaping of the lots. An undisturbed buffer of at least 50 feet is provided to the edge of wetland areas in all locations.

Ms. Fagerheim and Mr. Mullally, abutters to the project, expressed concern over water runoff, flooding concerns and water flow downhill on Acorn Street. Mr. Merrikin provided an overview of the general flow of water/stormwater in the area.

On a motion made by Ms. Rich, seconded by Mr. Lee, it was voted unanimously at 8:30 p.m. to continue the public hearing to Monday, May 21, 2018, 7:30 p.m.

## **Other Business:**

#### **Conservation Commission Member**

Mr. Ramcharan Khalsa was appointed by the Selectmen, however, he had not yet been sworn in so was unable to vote at the meeting.
