

Airplane Noise Advisory Committee Meeting Minutes

Ms. Musto called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Cronin Conference Room of the Town Hall.

During Citizens Speak, Kathryn Winn and Jeffrey Jacobsen, 53 Brandon Road, addressed the Committee concerning the impacts of airplane noise.

During Citizens Speak, Andrew Schmidt, 52 Buckingham Road, addressed the Committee concerning the impacts of airplane noise.

During Citizens Speak, an emailed statement from Judith Kennedy, 170 Atherton Street, concerning the impacts of airplane noise was read aloud.

Ms. Musto and Mr. Blanchard updated the Committee on the discussion at the Board of Selectmen's meeting on November 12, 2014.

The Committee discussed the proposed 4L RNAV and sending Town Counsel names of aviation attorneys/subject matter experts who have experience with legal proceedings involving the Federal Aviation Administration.

The Committee discussed strategies to address the airplane impact in Milton including working with Federal legislatures and agencies, drafting a letter for the Board of Selectmen to send to those legislatures and agencies via certified mail, drafting a form letter for the Board of Selectmen to post on the Town website allowing residents to contact those legislatures and agencies, and addressing our State legislatures regarding the State Constitution which provides "freedom from excessive and unnecessary noise."

Ms. Christiansen and Mr. Zambuto discussed the specifics of a data request that will be made to Massport regarding airplane traffic and flight paths over Milton. They will continue to refine the data request and hope to send the request to Massport via the Board of Selectmen.

The Committee discussed specific steps they believe the Federal Aviation Administration could take to reduce the airplane impact on Milton including changing the altitude of the final

approach (higher/steeper), moving flight patch over the water, and distributing the flight paths over area communities in a fair and equitable fashion.

The Committee discussed their membership including the current vacancy and whether having an attorney as a member would benefit the Committee.

The next Airplane Noise Advisory Committee was scheduled for Wednesday, January 7, 2015 at 7:00 p.m. in the Keyes Community Room, Milton Public Library. This meeting will be a strategy meeting with invitations to attend being extended to Senator Brian Joyce, Representative Walter Timilty, and the Board of Selectmen.

The meeting adjourned at 8:45 p.m.
