Chair Cristina Ashjian called the meeting to order at 5:40 PM, and the Minutes of the last Commission meeting on March 19, 2012 were approved without changes.

Cristina announced that Moultonborough had been successful with its grant application for a Plan NH Community Charrette. The charrette (focus Moultonborough Village revitalization) will take place on Friday, July 20th (midday onward, with public input session in the evening) and Saturday, July 21st, with the final presentation mid-afternoon. The Town needs to solicit donations to cover the \$5,000 contribution to Plan NH for associated costs of the report and exercise. More information and publicity for this event will be forthcoming in June.

The Commission received updates on the Master Plan Implementation Committee (next meeting 6/25/12, 5:30 PM) and the painting of the Moultonborough Town House / Middle Neck School (to be completed by the 4th of July). Additionally, the Commission reviewed the status of Lakes Region area historic properties currently on the market and briefly discussed proposed porch renovations to the Bernow/Troop Family LLC property on Sheridan Road.

A discussion of ongoing programs and projects for 2012 ensued. The HC unanimously approved its work plan for 2012. The draft Demolition Review Ordinance, prepared in 2011 with Planner Bruce Woodruff, will be reviewed in June by the Planning Board and by other relevant parties. The Roxmont Project Archaeology field school originally scheduled for June 2012 was cancelled; however, the Division of Historical Resources team will conduct a site survey on May 31st. Cristina will keep the HC informed as more information becomes available.

The next HC meeting will be at 5:30 PM on Monday, June 18th.
