March 25, 1976

Roland Sallada, Thomas Mansfield, Oliver Andrews and Betty Hooper present.

Mr. Everett Tingley and his son , Everett, brought in a petition containing 328 names in favor of upholding the decision of the vote at Town Meeting of March 1976 opposing the zoning ordinance. ^{MR. SALLADA} Roland read them another petition presented by Marian Chittim requesting reinstatement of the original Interum Zoning Ordinance. There was much discussion on the rules of calling a special Town Meeting. Mr. Tingley wanted this article to be included on the Warrant to be voted on at the next regular Town Meeting. The Selectmen will notify Mr. Tingley if this matter should come to a court session.

Pistol permits were renewed for Walter Kirsch and Fred Chancey.

Police Chief John Ballou and special officer, Mark Walsh were in to argue the police fee for the officer covering the dance sponsored by the Bi-centennial Committee. They accused interference from the Selectmen. The majority of the Board voted that the Bi-centennial Committee should pay for police duty for all their functions except on July 4, which the Town will pay half the bill. In this respect, the Selectmen will meet with the Police Chief and representatives of the Playground Asso. and the Hand-tub Asso. scheduled for Thursday April 1 at 7:00 pm
