

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

April 22, 1976

Thomas Mansfield, Oliver Andrews and Betty Hooper present.
Roland Sallada arrived at 10:00pm.

Mr. Campbell, who is planning to build a home on land purchased from Land/Vest came in to see what steps he had to take in preparation, and he applied for a drive-way permit.

Mr. Decate, who is building a new home, came in to see if he could get some idea what his assessment will be. Tom offered a ball-park figure from what the Selectmen had observed, as between \$22,000 and \$30,000.

Walter Tirrell came in to check his sub-division map and he borrowed one of his maps to be copied, and will return it. He also checked the Elderly Exemptions on Jack Hopcroft and his father, Lester Tirrell. The Selectmen answered his questions to his satisfaction.

Hermann Walker came in asking for financial assistance. He is on unemployment and the checks are not forthcoming and he needs money for food. He has a promise of two jobs and plans to look into them. The Selectmen suggested he contact Welfare Officer, Harold Strong, for temporary assistance.

Trustee of Trust Funds, Reginald Hayes, brought in the accumulated monies from the New Road Equipment Capital Reserve Fund, closing the fund in the amount of \$17,543.45. The amount of \$12,424.55 will be withdrawn from the Revenue Sharing Savings Account to go with the Capital Reserve Fund to pay for the new Road Grader, as voted at Town Meeting - Article 12.

Lorenz Perry, Goffstown Road Agent, has suggested that the New Boston road grader donate time at the 4-H grounds, as they are planning to do (Goffstown).

The Selectmen discussed drive-ways projects with Almus Chancey, and he promised to start taking care of some of them as soon as possible.

Mark Walsh's trailer burned this afternoon and he came in for some kind of determination for the bank, for the purpose of borrowing money to build a home, after he advised the bank that New Boston does not at this time have any building codes.

Roger Hartleb's gravel permit was reviewed. Thomas Mansfield moved to re-issue this permit. Gus Andrews seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously.

The Selectmen are planning to go to the bank in the morning to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
