

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

May 27, 1976

Present were Roland Sallada, Oliver Andrews and Betty H. Prior to the regular meeting (7:00pm) the Selectmen viewed the property of Eric Johnson who had violated the junk car ordinance. They found the property in satisfactory condition. They also viewed the trailer of Michael Cote and the property of Arthur Houghton, Jr.

A Trailer Hearing was opened at 8:15 pm at the request of Walter Tirrell for lot #15. Those present were: Richard Warnock, Mr. Kissel and Walter Tirrell. Roland conducted the hearing and notified all present that all abutters had been notified of Mr. Tirrell's intentions and the hearing had been properly published. Mr. Warnock and Mr. Tirrell voted in favor of the trailer. The hearing was closed at 8:30. The Selectmen will act on the request and notify Mr. Tirrell by letter of their decision.

A formal complaint was made by Beulah Hayes against Arthur Houghton, Jr. in regards to his having too many junk cars (unregistered) on his property, which is in violation of the Town Ordinance. A letter will follow to Mr. Houghton in this respect.

Regarding the Cote trailer, they found him in violation of the trailer ordinance inasmuch as his present foundation does not conform. Mr. Norman LaMarche was also in violation for having 2 unregistered cars on his property. Both will receive letters of protest, and will be given 30 days to comply.

A unanimous vote was taken in favor of the Tirrell trailer.

The Selectmen voted that the weathervane taken from the old school house is the property of the Historical Society and will be in their possession when they locate a permanent home. Meanwhile, it will be stored in the Selectmen's Office.

It has been brought to our attention that one of the trees in the Town Common has been maliciously stripped of its bark from the base to the first branches.

Mr. Robert Thomas bought a large town map and 2 small ones
Mrs. David Rice (Martha) applied for a pistol permit.

Robert Todd came in regarding the Wason & Cronin timber cutting. Mr. Bean, Forester, will be holding \$100 to repair the Town Road from Old Coach Road to Beaverpond Campground, after completion of the timber cutting operation.

The Selectmen voted to pay Robert Laake \$40 for 2 loads of loam to landscape the town property adjacent to Ryan's fence.
