Mabel Hodge, Town Clerk, came in to bring the Jury list up to date. Names were submitted to complete the list.

Patricia Getman reported that the Bicentennial appeal for Federal funds in the amount of \$924.00 for the purpose of repairs to the depot station has been granted. She also asked for \$500 of the town appropriation to pay for the purchase of necklaces (to contain bicentennial coins) and to pay the bank which is to play on the 4th of July.

The bids to paint the old fire house were opened.

Roland moved the Selectmen accept Mr. Hoyt's bid. Tom seconded the motion and the motion was accepted. Mr. Hoyt was contacted by telephone and he agreed to start next week.

Gravel Removal Permits were approved for Charles B. Townes(3) and 1 for Donald Wheeler.

Robert Gaither came in with pictures of the Beverly Marletta house to try to convince the Selectmen that it was, in fact, only a one-story dwelling.

The Selectmen were prepared to borrow additional monies to clean up the school appropriation, when it was noted from

public information that the school district owes New Boston approximately \$29,000. They will wait for more information on this matter.
