

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

June 24, 1976

Present were Roland Sallada, Oliver Andrews and Betty Hooper.

Road Agent, Almus Chancey, reported Mrs. Philip Harvell complained of traffic speeding by her house on Hooper Hill. She suggested that the Road Agent put some bumps in the road to discourage this. Naturally this was frowned upon.

Mr. Chancey offered to paint the guard rails of the bridge in the center of town and clean up the "square" for the 4th of July. The Selectmen thought this a good plan.

A letter was received from Mrs. William Monbouquette complaining about the Donaher and Marshall dogs harassing her when she passed by on foot. Chief Ballou was called and he agreed to take care of this situation.

George O. St. John, in behalf of his father George St. John, reported to the Selectmen that Wilcox Co. who is cutting lumber on the Town Lot, has damaged many ^{unmarked} trees with their equipment and the trees will undoubtedly die. The Selectmen suggested the Forestry Committee appraise the damage and bill the Wilcox co. for damages. Robert Todd was contacted by telephone and he will call Mr. Bean, the Forester on this program, to register the complaint.

The following "Paid Vacation Plan" regarding the Road Agent and road crew was proposed by the Board of Selectmen and agreed upon by the Road Agent: one week paid vacation after 1 full year steady employment; 2 weeks paid vacation after 5 full years steady employment; "pay" being 45 hours at current hourly rate. This policy pertains to full time employees only; this policy becomes effective as of June 24, 1976.
