

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

September 9, 1976

Present were Roland Sallada, Thomas Mansfield, Oliver Andrews and Betty Hooper.

John Sereno came in to make corrections on his assessed property. He advised us that he is buying his mother's property on Joe English Road.

Linda Rollins came in for advise whether she had to take her case of pruchasing land from Victor Barss to the Planning Board for sub-division. She was advised to attend their next meeting and present the problem to them.

George Hawkins discussed his assessment on land with the Selectmen.

The following members of the Little Peoples Kindergarten met with the Selectmen to discuss the use of the Common to hold a flea market for an "Apple-fest" under their sponsorship: Pam Peterson, Sara Chapman, Mrs. Weatherwax, Sandy Gallup, Mary Anne Martel and Joanne Luneau. Mr. Don Chapman also attended. They were given written permission to use the black-top area and not the lawn, for concentrated activities.

Warren Moss was asked to meet with the Selectmen regarding the job of Town Hall custodian, since being advised that Mr. Hickey will be unable to perform these duties, due to illness. He agreed to try it. He was advised that at a meeting with the Selectmen and the School Board, it was agreed that the School custodian would clean up after school lunches each day.

September 9, 1976

Kenneth Marvell dropped in to advise the Selectmen that the Fair Association of the Hillsboro County 4-H has written a letter to the State Highway Department to meet with them to try to induce them to eliminate the hump in the road on Route 13 between Daniels Garage and the 4-H Fair grounds entrance.
