SPECIAL MEETING  
RE: JOHN RASKIEWICZ VS. TOWN OF NEW BOSTON, N. H.  
GRAVEL REMOVAL PERMIT

September 16, 1976

Attending the meeting were the three ~~Selectmen~~ Selectmen, Atty. Stephen Spielman, representing the Town, John Raskiewicz and his attorney, Frank Holland.

Mr. Spielman made a general statement that this was ~~not~~ a meeting to make application on the same basis as any other applicant.

Mr. Holland stated that he and his client were present to get together with the Selectmen to hear their areas ~~of~~ of concern.

Mr. Sallada asked if they planned to make application to remove more than 10,000 cubic yards of gravel. The answer was, yes. To this, Mr. Sallada stated that this would automatically mean a hearing on this application would be in order. He asked what would happen if, at the hearing, some new matters which had not been previously discussed, would be brought up. Mr. Holland advised that a recess could be called to discuss any new areas.

At this point, Mr. Spielman suggested that each item of the gravel ordinance be considered one by one and try to see what the Selectmen's views are.

Mr. Holland consistently chose to compare Mr. Raskiewicz's gravel removal application with that of J. J. Cronin, which had been approved.

Mr. Holland was asked in what direction the trucks involved would be running. He did not know. Mr. Sallada then stated that under the circumstances, since they had no information to make judgment, it would be impossible for them to make any decisions without a written application, and the Selectmen feel that they had no right to pre-judge the actions that might come up at a hearing.

Mr. Holland now gathered up his brief case and pertinent papers and declared he felt he could accomplish nothing here since the Selectmen seemed unwilling to do anything until they received a gravel removal application from his client. He suggested that perhaps they would prefer to continue the matter in court. He offered that his next step would be to prepare a new application.

At Mr. Holland's departure (with Mr. Raskiewicz), Mr. Spielman remarked that he felt Mr. Holland's conduct here was unbecoming to the needs of his client.
