

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

May 12, 1977

Present were Thomas Mansfield, Oliver Andrews and Betty Hooper.

Carl Steven Strand applied for a pistol permit.

Charles Martin renewed his blasting permit.

A Trailer Hearing was held at the request of Richard Warnock to place a trailer on his property. Rodrigue Cloutier Telephoned his vote of approval. Those present were Mr. & Mrs. Richard Warnock, Mr. & Mrs. George Kissel and Edward Colburn, Mr. Warnock's engineer. The trailer would be placed on Lot #16. It was brought out that in the case of any deviations from the trailer ordinance regarding a trailer, the Zoning Ordinance takes precedence.

Mr. Warnock has a definite drainage problem, due to work done on the road by Mr. Tirrell. This work has also left a large hole as a water collection basin, posing great dangerto small children. The Selectmen will view the site in the morning.

The trailer permit was approved.

Robert Todd submitted two drive-way permits for Roger Binette, accompanied by a map of the site. He also took an application form for "intent to cut".

Dan McCreary came in in regard to his building permit application. Since no actual work has been started on his proposed Post Office, there is much question whether he is exempt, being as he started paper work on his project in 1976, when the town had no Ordinance. The Selectmen were advised by counsel, David H. Nixon, to deny the application and turn it over to the Board of Adjustment.
