

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

August 18, 1977

Present were Oliver Andrews, Roland Sallada and Betty Hooper.

Mrs. Henry Daniels came in to investigate the "application to cut" by Roger Starkey, Surry, N. H. who has cut <sup>lumber</sup> from their property. She claims he paid for much less than what was actually cut. She was advised on other routes to check on.

Mr. Francis Moore, surveyor for Henry and Bernice Daniels, applied for drive@ways per each sub-division lot.

Victor Conklin, Leo LaChance and Roland Neves met with the Selectmen in regard to Mr. LaChance's interest in the purchase of land owned by Mr. Neves and Mr. Kilmartin on Wilson Hill Road. Harold Strong, a member of the Planning Board, happened to be present in the room, and was invited to join in the discussion. Mr. LaChance described his credentials as a reputable developer and asked for the cooperation of the town officials should he purchase the land in question. Mr. Sallada asked him if he was familiar with the road situation. He said he was, and that was the reason he primarily was here. The road in question runs from Bedford Road cross lots down to Route 13, a short part of each entry being town road, the remainder having been closed subject to gates and bars at a previous town meeting. Mr. Neves asked what was required to change the status of this road. He was advised that an article must be entered in the town warrant to be voted on by the people at Town Meeting. Mr. LaChance asked about the possibility of a Special Meeting. Mr. Sallada explained that a Special Town Meeting must be

requested and approved through the Superior Court and only for critical purposes.

The question was asked if (at Town Meeting) the Planning Board would endorse their plan of approximately 60 units, and ultimately, the Selectmen giving their approval. The reply was that this could not be predicted.

Mr. Sallada quoted the specifications for a town road that they might be prepared in the event they carry through with plans of developping.
