

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

August 25, 1977

Present were Thomas Mansfield, Roland Sallada and Betty Hooper.

George Hawkins brought in his sub-division plan of his property and applied for a drive-way permit.

Donald Stout called to complain about the dump burning illegally and also to report the unlawful use of the New Boston dump by non-residents. He was assured that the Selectmen did not know of either of these cases, but are doing their best to meet State regulations. Mr. Stout later arrived at the office for further discussion. He reproached the Selectmen for not adhering to State law by not introducing an alternative disposal method at both dumps. He was informed that there are many towns in violation of this law primarily for financial reasons. The Selectmen are abreast of all State laws and definitely plan to cooperate with the will of the people.

Building permits were approved for Gary Luneau and Dino Rossi.

Mr. & Mrs. David Inman came in with Robert Todd with a map of the Nicholas Vardaro property which was subdivided to allot them about 2 acres. There is a small piece of property (Dunbar land) which abuts theirs which is owned by the town through tax collector's deed and they are interested in buying from the town. They were advised it would have to be sold at public auction. The Selectmen will meet with the Conservation Commission and the Forestry Committee next Thursday, Sept. 1,

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in order to discuss the sale of the property in question.

Sandra Gallup and Roberta Gray came in to ascertain the date of a previously scheduled-~~Octoberfest~~ Applefest for Oct. 1 to be held on the town common. They had noted a digging project on the common and were concerned. They were assured that the date was recorded and hopefully the project on the common, which is for septage problems, would be finalized before October.
