

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

September 8, 1977

Present were Thomas Mansfield, Roland Sallada, Oliver Andrews and Betty Hooper.

A meeting was scheduled with the members of the Planning Board for 8:00, but the meeting was cancelled because the time was not convenient to all concerned.

George Houghton, town dump custodian, came in to discuss whether he could burn stumps. He expressed disgust with conditions at the dump and was upset with the number of out-of-town people that are using it. The burning of the dump was discussed. The Selectmen's interpretation of correspondence from the State Pollution Control is that burning is permitted if an extension to the new is applied for.

Mr. Houghton threatened if something wasn't done to improve condition at the dump, he would offer his resignation.

Richard Moody brought in statements from Plastic Techniques for the Selectmen to pursue. The company plans to lease 2 acres from Donald Wyam to set up a factory building and the concern is what would this do to the property regarding taxes. The Selectmen will review the plans and report to them later.

Barbara Stewart was issued a building and driveway permits.

Herman Walker renewed his pistol permit.

Mr. Wallace Wood of Weare, N. H. will bull-doze the town dump next week. The Selectmen have been trying unsuccessfully to have this job done since July.
