

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

December 8, 1977

Present were Thomas Mansfield, Oliver Andrews, Roland Sallada and Betty Hooper.

A trailer hearing was scheduled for the application of J. Russell Lee new owner of the James Hawkes property. Roland enlightened Mrs. Lee of the conditions of the Trailer Ordinance. Present for the hearing were Mrs. Lee, Mr. Sullivan, Mrs. Lee's father, for whom the trailer is to be erected, and Mrs. Robert St. Pierre.

Mrs. St. Pierre said she had no objections to only a single trailer.

Being as the Lees are placing a second dwelling on their land, Tom felt the interpretation of the building ordinance would require they subdivide the necessary two acres. Mr. William Brendle, chairman of the Board of Adjustment, was called by phone for his opinion. It was suggested the Lees approach the Planning Board and the Board of Adjustment. Mrs. Lee admitted they were not in a hurry and were only doing the primary work with the idea of placing the trailer sometime after April 15, 1978.

The Selectmen voted unanimously to grant the permit with the effective date being April 15, 1978.

Patricia Getman returned all the balance of the Bicentennial materials and money collected.

Bill Forest was again contacted to see if any work had been done on the conference room. He said some electrical work had been done, with the heating system to be installed tomorrow.
