

SPECIAL MEETING - Information Hearing - Air Pollution Control Jan. 9, 1970

Three Selectmen and Betty Hooper present. Approximately 30 interested citizens were present. The meeting was opened by Roland Sallada at 8:20 pm. He announced a third hearing would be held on January 23. He then turned the meeting over to David Woodbury, chairman of the Dump Committee.

He recommended the town not get involved with the town of Wilton since they are far from ready with their plans. The committee checked into Souhegan Land Fill and the cost of this program would be 7 1/2 cents per capita. They made a comparative study with this and the cost of keeping a dump in town and found the town dump to be less expensive. Mr. Woodbury's personal feelings fell between Souhegan Land Fill or contracting with someone for town land fill. He then introduced Mr. Robert Alger from Sanitas Waste Disposal.

He said a good guide line for judging the amount of waste to be accumulated would be 3 pounds per capita per day. He said we could still stock-pile metal, wood, etc. for a transfer station. Souhegan estimated 90 - 100 cubic yards per week from New Boston.

Dr. Brooks asked if his company would install transfer station and the reply was yes. He was asked where his company hauls the waste and his answer was to Danbury, N H.

Mr. Leon Daniels asked if the transfer station would accommodate a pick up truck and the answer was yes. Mr. Daniels made the point that the Town of Candia does not find recycling feasible.

Mr. Sallada reported that the State has OK'd our lower dump for special materials.

Kenneth Marvell recommended recycling.

Ella Daniels reported the opinion of the Committee for the best system was to contract the job and keep the dump in town. The members have talked with other towns and many are doing the same thing..

The cost of preparing the dump site was discussed. It was estimated that a bull-dozer would be needed for about two days and fencing would cost about \$1,000.

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The general concensus was to keep the dump operation in town and asking citizens of New Boston to bid on the contract. Dr. Brooks recommended that specifications be prepared to submit to bidders. Mr. Woodbury agreed to meet with anyone interested in the job.

Mr. Charles Wason informed the meeting that he had checked 3-4 towns in Massachusetts which operated their own dumps and in talking with the dump custodian, found the town land fill was very satisfactory. These towns also operate on a two-day a week schedule.

Mr. Sallada asked that the dump committee prepare the specifications for the bidders, inasmuch as the Selectmen will be involved in a tight schedule at least until Town Meeting.

Mr. Woodbury advised that the State has agreed to our land-fill with proper engineering.

The meeting adjourned at 9:45 pm
