

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

October 19, 1978

Present were Oliver Andrews, Roland Sallada, Thomas Mansfield and Betty Hooper.

Gail Parker, School Board Member, came in to discuss the use of the use of the trash dumpster which has been installed next to the town hall back door. It was agreed upon that this would be for the use of the school lunch garbage and school trash only. To insure this, keys will be made and it will be locked. In regard to the school custodian, Fred Roberts, school principal, requested that any communications with the custodian be done through him or the school board. The Selectmen requested that they be also included in any communication. The school custodian and the town hall custodian must be regarded as two separate jobs with each their own duties.

It was brought to the attention of the Selectmen that a trailer has been stored on the property of Mr. Raymond Bailey, placed on a subdivided two acre lot, purchased by Mr. Dwight Davis, without benefit of a trailer permit. Mr. Davis came in to apply for a permit and he was then advised of the rulse of the Trailer Ordinance. He promised to remove the trailer and later make application.

Dr. Samuel Brooks came in to state that New Boston is required to provide an area for disposal of septic sweage, a directive from the State Pollution Board. He was shown all the town correspondence to the City of Manchester in an effort to use their facilities. We have not as yet received an answer to our request.

Dr. Tempelman, pastor for the Community Church, came in for information regarding a request he had received ^{from} Mr. Daniel Zwillinger for financial assistance. The Selectmen supplied all information of dealings the Selectmen have had with Mr. Zwillinger and reasons they feel he should not qualify for assistance. The problem of the private road on the Mr. Zwillinger's property was thoroughly explained to Mr. Tempelman to prove the Selectmen do not intend to harrass the man, but are only abiding by the town rules and State rules. The problem of mail delivery was also discussed. It is illegal for mail to be delivered on private property, which is a Federal Law. By some misunderstanding, the road under discussion is getting mail delivery. This is also a point upsetting to Mr. Zwillinger, with the prospect of mail delivery being discontinued.
