

SELECTMEN's MEETING

January 4, 1979

Present were Oliver Andrews, Thomas Mansfield and Betty Hooper.

Pistol permits were issued to David Tiley and Harvey Surette.

Gravel Removal renewals were issued to Milton Elliott and Donald Byam.

A building permit submitted by Regis Lehman was reviewed. He is planning on selling his home to Plastics Technique, Inc. for the purpose of converting the building into office space. The application was denied and turned over to the Board of Adjustment.

Charles Sanford, representative of the Kingdom, brought in a map of their property showing that the Town of New Boston owns a $3\frac{1}{2}$ acre piece of land acquired by Tax Collector's deed abutted all around by the property of The Kingdom. He advised that his son would be interested in purchasing this land if the price was right. The Selectmen promised to look into the possibility of an auction of this property.
