

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

February 15, 1979

Present were Oliver Andrews, Roland Sallada ~~xxxx~~, Thomas Mansfield, and Betty Hooper.

A trailer hearing was held at the request of Frederick Cleveland. Mr. & Mrs. Frederick Cleveland were the only ones present. Mr. Cleveland produced a map of the property and the exact location where the trailer was proposed to be placed. The Selectmen approved the trailer and a 45-day permit will be issued, the effective date to start Mar. 15. Being that this property had never been taxed, bills to cover the years 1977 and 1978 will be prepared for the 4.7 acres, located in Riverdale near the Weare line.

George Houghton was called in to discuss the possibility of expanding the dump days to include Sunday. It was expected that this proposal will be introduced at town meeting. Mr. Houghton advised that he would never attend the dump on Sundays.

August Gomes, Jr. came in to get the reaction of the Selectmen regarding underground cable to the property of William Locke on Hooper Hill Road. Mr. Gomes did not advise running cable under a town road, since there is a possibility of the cable being accidentally dug up. Mr. Gomes plans on putting in his bid on this project, but wished to resolve all avenues of discontent before doing so. He suggested asking Public Service to place an extra pole and then burying the cable on Mr. Locke's property which would not, then, interfere with the town road. Mr. Locke, who was present, said he would consider this option.

Mr. Locke then displayed a model of the house he would like to build and still retain the cottage that already exists. His building permit was automatically denied and was referred to the Board of Adjustment.

Betsy Moore and Mary Anne Martel, representing the Town Hall Committee, came in to announce a community clean-up day on March 3 & 4 to freshen the lower town hall and paint the walls. They wanted permission to buy paint for this ~~purpose~~ purpose. Permission granted. They also informed the Selectmen that Ivan Byam, the present town hall custodian, wishes to terminate his duties. The Selectmen will advertise for applications for a new custodian shortly.

The Recreation Commission will sponsor basketball playing in the town hall on Wednesday evenings from 6:00 to 8:00 pm with the stipulation that a responsible adult attend and chaperone each session.

Joseph Trimbur came in for permission to include an article in the town warrant to ask the town to accept a road on his property.

Milton Elliott came in to see if the Selectmen had done any more on granting John Raskiewicz's Gravel Removal permit. The Selectmen advised that as far as they were concerned, the permit was already granted. Mr. Elliott reviewed all the proposals and amendments and will refer them to Mr. Raskiewicz.
