

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

June 14, 1979

Present were Roland Sallada, Thomas Mansfield, Merrill Todd and Betty Hooper.

The Selectmen met with the Town Hall Committee at 8:00 pm. With the ~~renignation~~ termination of Mary Anne's (Martel) term, it was suggested to ask Joanne Luneau to be appointed as a member. Betsy Moore will ask her.

The estimate of \$175 - \$200 was proffered by Mark Lehr for the painting of the Town Hall hallway and repairs to windows. A notice will be placed in the Goffstown News asking for other estimates from anyone else who might be interested. Gault's Plumbing will be contacted to repair problems in the Men's Room. Replacing Lock's on the town hall doors were discussed. A bid has been submitted by George St. John in the amount of ~~\$185~~ \$261. Joanne Luneau suggested that an exhaust fan be installed in the kitchen. It was also mentioned that the stove is not functioning properly. Howard ^{Town} offered that he understands an inspection by the Fire Marshall is in the offing and feels that perhaps we should wait until we find out his recommendations. Roland Sallada feels this should be a school project being as the school lunch has the primary usage. It is hoped to take care of all details while school is not in session.

Roland was of the opinion that the town hall not be available for bathroom facilities for the summer recreation programs. It was also suggested the upper hall be closed to the public on July 4.

Betsy Moore publicly thanked Mary Anne Martel for her strong support as a member of the Town Hall Committee. The feeling was unanimous.

The Selectmen met with Victor and Katherine Daniels to discuss their application for Current Use. In spite of acreage of 6 +, Mr Daniels wishes this property be put into Current Use and not Discretionary Easement.

Mr. Daniels informed the Selectmen that the Conservation Committee has shown a desire to purchase this land. Following much discussion, the Selectmen agreed to accept the application under Current Use Ch. C-2B2
