

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

September 6, 1979

The Selectmen met with the Selectmen of the town of Lyndeboro, the New Boston Road Committee and Road Agent, Almus Chancey at 7:00 pm on the Francestown Turnpike to view Mountain Road pertaining to a petition received by both towns before mentioned extended from Mr. & Mrs. Roland Cook and Mr. & Mrs. Richard Dilley requesting this road be instituted into a one-way road (a portion of it). Mr. & Mrs. Kenneth Broman would desire Mountain Road be one-way only up to their driveway. Due to the road being barely wide for two cars to pass, their daughter had an accident here and therefore the request. The Selectmen of Lyndeboro suggested both towns place an article in the Warrant for Town Meeting asking for this area of the road be designated a one-way for a year trial. Selectman Rogers of Lyndeboro explained there is no future development of the land along this road expected due to the plans known of the land owners, therefore making little additional traffic. Both towns agreed to place an article in the Warrant.

Nonah Poole has resigned from the Planning Board and it was recommended that Ella Daniels be appointed to this seat. The Planning Board asked the Selectmen to appoint another alternate.

Pamela Strand was issued a temporary pistol permit awaiting new forms from the State.

Town hall Custodian, Robert Gagnon, was asked to come in to discuss his duties regarding the town Common. He promised to keep it in better condition. Mr. Gagnon advised the Selectmen that the baseball teams had asked him for the use of the town hall facilities during their picnic. He was told to have them contact the Selectmen.

Jay Marden came in to pick up maps he had asked to duplicate from the Tax Map and he argued that the price of \$6.50 each was too high. He took the maps with the intention of taking them to Manchester for a comparison cost estimate.
