Present were Roland Sallada, Thomas Mansfield, Merrill Todd and Betty Kooper.

Milton and David Elliott came in to renew the Gravel Removal application to resume operation at the Everett Tingley bank. They hope to start work within a month. Sel. Todd questioned whether there would be the same problem with early morning noise which had caused many complaints. David promised there would not be the noise, since they were not using the machine responsible for the noise. They were applying for a permit to remove 50,000 yards and would be operating 5 - 6 trucks. They expected to be working this sand pit intermittently, moving to other pits from time to time. Sel. Todd asked about the new driveway which had been built at the site. ^{MR. ELLIOTT} ~~Milton~~ said this driveway is not ready for use, but will be a future exit, coming onto Route 13, approved ^{by} the State. In regard to the rock barrier which has been removed, ^{MR. ELLIOTT} ~~Milton~~ said they had removed the log so as to improve upon the safety of the area (at the request of the State) but had not finished the project being as they moved their operation to Weare. They estimated they have removed about half the available gravel at this site and it would take about 4 to 6 years to exhaust the supply. Sel. Mansfield reminded them that their first application had specified only two trucks would be used. They made no reply. The Selectmen asked for a copy of the insurance bond which Mr. Tingley has posted. Selectmen voted to defer action for the time being.

Pistol permit renewals were issued to Richard Szopa and Merrill Todd.

A building permit to build a shed was issued to John Colburn.

Fire Chief, James Dodge came in to discuss various budget items. He asked to have the fire station lawn mowed along with the Common. To be considered will be a new flag pole in the town budget.
