

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

April 10, 1980

Present were Thomas Mansfield, Merrill Todd, Roy Lowell and Betty Hooper.

The following appointments were made: William Elliott and Donald Prouty were reappointed as Alternates to the Board of Adjustment for a one year term.

Building Permits were issued to Arthur Johnston and Tingley Family Trust.

Pistol Permit was approved to Kenneth Holbrook.

Robert Colburn renewed his Gravel Removal Permit for 10,000 yards.

Maurice Guay and Everett Tingley filed Timber Tax forms.

William Wichman, Lynette Tautkus and David Poole, Jr. filed Current Use applications.

Louis Maynard, owner of the Molly Stark Tavern located on Amherst Rd., Route 13, came in to complain about the Gravel Removal operation by Milton Elliott. He feels the noise from the trucks passing is excessive and he also pointed out that the log barrier which ~~they~~ <sup>was</sup> placed along the bank bordering Amherst Road to prevent rocks entering the highway is inadequate. He added that the aesthetic value of the area has been destroyed. Sel. Mansfield agreed in regard to the inadequate barrier and promised Mr. Elliott would receive a letter from this office asking that he improve this situation. Regarding the aesthetics of the area, Sel. Mansfield said there was nothing in the specifications of Mr. Elliott's permit stressing how much of the hill could be removed.

Fire Chief, James Dodge, came in to ~~discuss~~ to ask for the authority to buy a used fire truck instead of repairing one as previously intended. It now appears more feasible to sell the truck intended for repairs and use the money to purchase another used truck in better condition. They expect they could get \$3,000 for their old truck. This seemed agreeable with the Selectmen.

Chief Dodge also wished to make the Selectmen aware of the impact that the plans for cluster-housing at Bailey Pond ~~will~~ <sup>would</sup> place on the Fire Dept. and the Police Dept. He feels the Dept. ~~will~~ <sup>would</sup> have to restructure for full time service.

Natt Rockwell came in to inquire about sponsoring Little League. Sel. Mansfield suggested he contact Sandy Gallup of the Recreation Commission.
