

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

May 1, 1980

Present were Thomas Mansfield, Merrill Todd, Roy Lowell and Betty Hooper.

The Selectmen met at 7:00 pm at the fire station site with Mr. & Mrs. Leon Daniels to review the plans on the paving and landscaping of the Fire Station driveway.

Stephen Strand came in to report having notified the authorities at the State Water Pollution Control of the improper septage systems being installed by Mr. Thomas Quirk at the Friendly Beaver Campground. He described the method being used as large plastic tubs being buried in the ground. Mr. Strand also offered to bring in a citizen of New Boston who would vouch that he had in fact lived at the campground using this as his legal residence which is contrary to the New Boston Building Ordinance. It is alleged that Mr. Quirk has instructed all the tenants of his campground to name other legal addresses in order to reside at the campground.

Donald Grosso came in to discuss the possibility of forming some kind of Citizen's Watch Group to band together for the purpose in assisting the police in noting and reporting any suspicious actions at any time of day or night. He offered his services to join together when called upon. The Selectmen considered this a good idea and will contact Police Chief Ballou for consideration. It was considered a good move to have a write-up in the paper notifying all that this is being done in the hopes of discouraging so many break-ins as New Boston has been experiencing.

John Bunting brought in move road names for approval.
