

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

May 15, 1980

Present were Thomas Mansfield, Merrill Todd, Roy Lowell and Betty Hooper.

The Selectmen went out early to inspect the Friendly Beaver Campground following reports of illegal actions regarding trailers and allowing permanent residency. Later in the evening, James Archibald volunteered information regarding this matter, since he was a resident of the campground last year. So that the Selectmen would not be aware of permanent residents, he said that each one was advised not to register a car in this town and not to pay a Resident Tax here. He advised his tenants to use a relative's address. Mr. Archibald reported Mr. Quirk had brought trailers into the grounds without benefit of Hearings or permits. He also claimed seeing an ad in the Milford Cabinet Press about a year ago where Mr. Quirk advertised rentals at \$125 a month.

Selectman Todd commented that they need something concrete to prove Mr. Quirk in violation. They noticed in their inspection that there have been additions built on trailers without permits to build. Sel. Mansfield remarked to Mr. Archibald that in the event that this case should go to court, the Selectmen would need someone to testify to the true actions at the campground.

Peter Dudley and Linda Pelletier came in ask permission to conduct an outdoor wedding (theirs) on the property of Paul Buchanan. The Selectmen will discuss the matter and give a definite reply next Thursday.

Timothy Trimbur came in for a permit to hold an out-door festival at Paul Buchanan's field with two bands playing and about 400 people to celebrate his birthday on June 21 from 3:00 pm to 11:00pm .

Sel. Mansfield looked upon this affair with disfavor considering the problems posed to the police, neighbors and the town in general from past experience. Mr. Trimbur will probably reconsider and hold a smaller affair at his own home.

A pistol permit renewal was issued to Lawrence Strausbaugh.

Building permits were issued to Andrew Belanger, Frank McCone and Stephen Hopf.

A contract between the Playground Asso and the Police Department was signed and witnessed allowing the use of the Depot Building to the Police Dept. for a designated time.
