

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

August 28, 1980

Present were Thomas Mansfield, Merrill Todd, Roy Lowell and Betty Hooper.

The Selectmen met at 7:15 with Mr. & Mrs. Daniels with Fire Chief, James Dodge and Fireman Harold Strong with the hope of finally resolving the dead-lock on the area allowed for a driveway on the Mill Rd. side of the fire station. The end of the meeting brought about satisfaction on both sides and now the project will be placed out for bid.

Judith Silver came in to ask for financial assistance . She is now living in Weare with the rent being \$400 per month. This is the area she has asked for help. The Selectmen agreed to pay her rent .

Michael Tremblay came in to get a permit to hold an out-door party at the back of his mother's property on Parker Road. Police Officer Fred Cutting was present and explained that the New Boston Police Dept. is limited in manpower this weekend and could not oversee the party. Permission was denied. Mr. Tremblay left leaving the impression that the party might still be held, but operating as a private party. In this event, the land owner, Joanne Tremblay, will be held responsible for all costs of damage, should there be any. The party was to be scheduled for August 29. Officer Cutting requested the ~~band band~~ band which is engaged to play , stop playing by 11:30 pm.

Mr. Thomas Quirk came in with Mr. Marvin Reichart who applied for a building permit to add another room to his camper for winter camping. He explained it is erected on a temporary basis coming in 5 foot sections which can be dismantled at any time. Sel. Mansfield felt this permit could not be issued being as the town has a court order against Mr. Quirk for this very reason of campers at his campground having illegal additions. Mr. Reichart emphasized he is not a resident of New Boston and produced evidence to substantiate his statement. The Selectmen chose not to take action on the building application until the court session is held.
