

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

October 16, 1980

Present were Thomas Mansfield, Merrill Todd and Betty Hooper.

Mr. & Mrs. Lawrence Paro came in for names and addresses of abutters which to the Leslie Perkins property ~~which~~ he plans to buy.

A Trailer Hearing was held at the request of Tony & Debbie Rice to place a temporary trailer on their property while they build their home. Present were: Mr. & Mrs. Richard Silvermail and Mr. & Mrs. Richard Gagne. Sel. Mansfield read the application. Mr. Rice asked that the Selectmen consider the application stating any limit in time to remove the trailer but allowing at least ~~the~~ four months. Mr. Gagne asked the permit be approved for temporary use, but that it be in writing and ~~he~~ asked about the septic system arrangements.

Mr. Rice said the trailer would be hooked to the permanent facilities.

Sel. Mansfield explained our Ordinance does not permit 2 dwellings on one lot, therefore they cannot retain the trailer after they move into the house. It was explained that a similar situation of allowing a temporary trailer was handled with the Vanden Berghs at the time that their home burned. The Selectmen will take the application under advisement and will give their opinion as soon as possible.

(Permission granted with a 6 month limit.)

Cecil Strong came in to get advise on where to find a ~~bonding~~ bonding Co. Selectmen offered suggestions.

Spenser Bennett of Bennett & Hadley came in to review the decision of the Selectmen to whom the bid on the Highway Garage was allotted.

Maureen Ryan and Donald Chapman came in to complain about the Town Office alarm system which sets off automatically apparently with no provocation awakening the towns people. They strongly feel a different system should be installed. The Selectmen will consider this suggestion.

Building Permits were issued to William Parker, Barbara King, Arthur Perkins, Alice Hunter and James Hansen.

Charles Houghton came in to discuss the Highway Building. Being as he was the lowest bidder on the structure (the bids were all too high, therefore the Selectmen elected to reject them all) the Selectmen wished to see if some kind of arrangements could be made with him to work on an hourly basis with the Selectmen purchasing the materials and perhaps having the Road crew giving some of ~~xx~~ its time in order to try to keep the cost down. Road Agent, Almus Chancey, was present at the discussion.
