

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

Sept. 10, 1981

Present were three Selectmen and secretary.

Library architect Mr. Ingram and Mr. Mulligan met with the Selectmen at 7:30 to discuss the progress of the library addition. The wall problem is being taken care of both physically and monetarily by the Trustees.

Mr. & Mrs. Edmund Novick came in to discuss a trailer which has been placed on his property on Rte. 114. He plans to locate the trailer to the back of his property for future rental. He made application for a trailer permit. The Selectmen granted him permission to store the trailer temporarily on his property until the hearing on October 1, 1981. He apologized for having brought the trailer to his property prematurely being that he was of the opinion that the new State trailer law offered this privilege.

A meeting was held in relation to the dog problem involving dogs barking day and night and disturbing the neighbors. Present were Paul Dionne, Kristi Rossi, Robert & Sandra Lamontagne, Kenneth and Jackie Malandrino and by request, Frank Scott, owner of the dogs in question. Formal complaints were read from Sandra Lamontagne and Kristi Rossi. Mr. Scott agreed to cooperate and has already insulated the outside walls of the barn to deaden the sound. He is also using shock collars for training dogs from barking. The meeting ended with total agreement and satisfaction that Mr. Scott is in sympathy with the problem.

Harold Strong reported in to discuss his bid on the septic ~~xxx~~ lagoon. The Selectmen asked exactly what specifications his bid contained. He proposed a bid of \$4,546.

The second bidder for the project was August Gomes who was also requested to explain his bid. His bid was in the amount of \$3,202. He had omitted the cost of asphalt. He was asked to resubmit a

a bid which included the cost of asphalt.

William Sears, who lives on Depot St., came in to request some kind of a street sign be placed at the entrance of Depot Street, which is a one-way street, which will deter the speed with which cars enter this area.

The Planning Board has requested that the Selectmen nominate a member to the Southern N. H. Planning Commission as a representative from New Boston.

It was moved and seconded to nominate Mr. August J. Gomes to this position. The motion carried.
