

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

Oct. 6, 1983

Three Selectmen and secretary present.

A Trailer Hearing was held at 7:30 pm at the request of Charles & Anne Nattila. Abutters present were Mr. William Bieschke, Mr & Mrs. Brian Irwin and Mr. Ernest Pelletier. Mr. Nattila explained that he wanted a temporary permit to place a trailer on his property while building a house for economic feasibility. The Selectmen, at times, have extended the curtesy of allowing a trailer on property for a two-year period during the building of a dwelling. Mr. Bieschke asked what would happen if not ready to move into in two years. Sel. Olson explained that the Selectmen would have the right to ask them to move the trailer, or the alternative would be for the owners to ask for an extention of time giving legitimate reasons.

None of the abutters objected to the placing of this trailer.

Sel. Mansfield moved to approve the temporary trailer for a period of two years. The motion passed unanimously. Agreement papers will be prepared and the applicants will be in the Selectmen's Office October 13 for signatures.

At 8:00 pm the Selectmen met with Mr. & Mrs. James ~~Ryan~~ Ryan regarding ~~rumors~~ rumors that they have converted their house into three apartments. They denied the truth of this rumor. They explained that they now have an apartment ready for rent and their daughter and husband lives with them.

They prepared a building permit which was approved for the removation of a one-family dwelling to a two-family dwelling.

William Sears came in to ask for the use of the Town Hall once a week for Cub Scouts meeting. Permission granted.

Richard & Verna Hall were asked to come in to rediscuss the purchase of property which abutts their property, which involves the town shed. He (Mr. Hall) was the second bidder on this property at a town auction and the Selectmen wanted to know if he wished to hold to his last bid which was \$9,500. He said definitely no. He asked if the Selectmen would put an article in the March warrant proposing that he be allowed to purchase the property for a specified amount of \$5,000. Sel. Mansfield advised against it. It is agreed that this property will be resold at a future auction.
