Three Selectmen and secretary present.

Edward Colburn came in to discuss the town accepting the road he has built according to town road specifications through his sub-division. He explained that a member of the Road Committee had approached him regarding the road. Mr. Colburn wanted to know if he was expected to also have the approval of the Road Committee. He has 1900 feet of road ready for acceptance The total length of the road will be approximately 4,700 feet. Later in the evening, Sel. Caldwell referred to the State Law Books looking for the legal way to accept a road for town maintenance. Nothing was found as yet.

At 8:20 pm, the bids were open for the contract to supply town buildings. John LaPlant, president of Burnham Fuel, was present and he was the only bidder. He was awarded the contract which he quoted at \$.95 9/10. Later in the evening Ella Daniels dropped off a bid from Daniels Garage. Being as the bid was presented too late, the bid was not considered.

Mr. LaPlant advised that a new furnace in the town hall should be considered since the present one does not run efficiently. We estimated the cost around \$5,000.

Sel. Olson asked if the Cub Scouts could rent the Town Hall on Nov. 15 for a special meeting. Agreed. Robert Olson, Scout Master, will be asked to come to discuss with the Selectmen the rent and use of the hall for Cub Scout activities on Monday Nov. 7.

Louis Maynard came in claiming harassment from John Bunting regarding the Fire Code specifically being accused of over-populating his restaurant which is designating to seat no more than 65. He wished to read this code. The Selectmen suggested he go to Concord for these records and law.

A 4-draw fire-proof file cabinet was brought into the Selectmen's Office for much needed additional space.

A Public Auction was scheduled to be held on Monday November 21, 7:00 pm at the Town Office Building.
