

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

March 23, 1987

Present were Selectmen Mansfield, Olson and Dodge and secretary.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Dodge at 7:30. The minutes of the meeting of March 16 were read and accepted as corrected.

At 7:30 the Selectmen met with Souhegan National Bank official, Raymond Woolsen. He familiarized the Selectmen with the new forms for Tax Anticipation notes and new agreement. He advised that when borrowing over \$100,000 they must file a special form with the IRS. He suggested that the School Board contact the Municipal Bond Bank when applying for the new school note for a special interest rate.

At 8:00 the selectmen met with Frank Fillmore. He extended letters from the Planning Board of which he needed clarification and interpretation of his agreement.

At 8:15 Barry Butler came in regarding specifications of Scobie road. He was informed of the town "specs" especially the width of the road required.

At 9:30 the Selectmen met with the new Road Agent, Lee Murray, who brought in three individuals who expressed interest in working for the New Boston Highway Dept. Louis Nikias applied for the heavy equipment operator job. Will also be happy to diversify duties. Would like \$8 - \$8.50 per hour.

Paul Walsh applied as truck driver. Also would be willing to diversify duties. Would like to start with \$7.00 at least.

Eric Bennett applied for heavy equipment operator.

The Selectmen will make a decision within a week.

At 9:35 the Selectmen met School Board members, Leslie Colburn and Frederick Green. The discussion was the subdivision of the former Victor Daniels property as to whether to offer the entire lot or only the area needed. Sel. Mansfield moved to deed the entire parcel of land, formally known as the Victor Daniels land, to the School District with the understanding that the school will return a portion of that land that lies between Route 13 and the new school parking lot, this action to be taken <sup>PRIOR to</sup> before the school meeting of 1988. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously. A letter from the Selectmen to the School Board will follow to bind the contract.

The Selectmen made the following appointments to the various Boards and Commissions:

Conservation Commission: reappoint Michele Drury and new alternate Kevin McLaronan.

Road Committee: reappoint George St. John.

Planning Board: reappoint Harold Strong, regular member; Alternates (to serve three year terms, per new law) Donald Grosso and Michael Richards.

Board of Adjustment: reappoint William Brendle.

Finance Committee: reappoint James Dane.

The meeting was adjourned at 12: midnight
