

MINUTES SELECTMEN'S MEETING - February 26, 1990

Present for the meeting were Selectmen Dodge and Johnston, Selectman Mansfield was away on vacation. Sandra Gendron took minutes.

Chief of Police John Ballou was in to discuss with the Selectmen a price he had negotiated with Honeywell to put his alarm system in working order. He had received one bid from another company for \$575. which would guarantee the system for one year; however, Honeywell will do the initial job for \$498., but charge \$15. per month for service which would include parts and labor. This amounts to \$180. per year whereas the other company would charge \$60. per hour for service plus parts. The Selectmen support John signing with Honeywell mainly because the alarm systems in other town buildings are monitored by Honeywell.

The public hearing scheduled to be held at 7:30 p.m. was opened by Selectmen Dodge in the absence of Chairman Mansfield, regarding the extension of the term of the Road Agent from one to three years. There being no one present, the hearing was held open for five minutes and at 7:35 p.m. declared closed by Selectmen Dodge.

Michael Pimento, McCurdy Road was in to discuss his letter of intent regarding his home heating and cooling business. It was the suggestion of the Board of Selectmen that Mike have his business on record especially should the new proposed zoning pass at the March town meeting. Michael explained that he did his bookkeeping at home, that the only stock was mainly leftovers from completed jobs, and that the only freon he kept was in his van. He completed the home business form and a copy would be forwarded to the Planning Board for site plan review.

Lisa Jeck, Weare Road was in regarding her letter of intent to establish a business from her home dealing with preparation of taxes and financial planning. She has no employees and sees most of her clients in a Goffstown office; however, with a growing family would like to make some appointments in her home. Again, she signed the form and a copy would be forwarded to the Planning Board for site plan review.

Susan LaRochelle, McCurdy Road was in also to establish a home business which would be hair dressing. She stated there would be no employees other than herself, she would take appointments only probably one day a week 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and one evening a week probably 6 p.m. to 10 p.m. and maybe a Saturday morning to begin with. Again, she signed the form and a copy would be forwarded to the Planning Board for site plan review.


In all of the above cases the Selectmen felt that the criteria for a home business was being met and it would be the decision of the Planning Board as to whether site plan review would be required.
