

MINUTES OF THE SELECTMEN'S MEETING - June 15, 1992

Present for the meeting which began at 7:00 p.m. were Selectmen Johnston and Pimenta with Sandra Gendron taking minutes. Selectman Dodge was unavailable for the meeting.

Recreation Director Sandy Gallup was in to discuss with the Board her plans for the "After School Program" which was to be held at one of the small buildings owned by the School District. Selectman Johnston advised Sandy to check with the Fire Department to make certain she would be in compliance with whatever they might deem necessary. Sandy stated that this program would not fall under state guidelines for such programs as kindergarten, contending the requirements would not be as stringent for her program. Discussion ensued as to what Sandy planned gaining the support of both Selectmen present.

John Ryan, Cemetery Road, was in to be interviewed for a position on the Forestry Committee. He stated that he was interested in learning what the committee does, and felt he was qualified to serve based on his background at one time where he was involved in selective the cutting of timber. He further stated that he had spoken to Jon Stout, recently appointed to the Forestry Committee, and was told that there was an opening.

Selectman Johnston stated that once the committee was filled, the members would all be new. He went on to state that the charge of the committee was to manage the town-owned forests, giving advice to the Board of Selectmen with regard to such areas as the harvesting of timber. John commented that he would like to become more involved in town affairs and is of the opinion that town-owned land should be used for the benefit of the community.

Selectman Johnston stated that he would like to have the committee meet with the Board of Selectmen on a quarterly basis to discuss the status of the various town-owned forests. John stated that he was willing to spend the time necessary to learn the forests and their management.

A decision on the appointment would be made when the full Board was present.


Armand Hebert, Sr., River Road, was in to inform the Board that Duke Winslow, abutting property owner to Mr. Hebert, was running a refrigerated trailer unit on his property for long stretches of time including all night, and Mr. Hebert stated that this was both noisy and annoying. He contended that Duke ran a multitude of businesses from this property and question the legality of such. Selectman Johnston would like the Board to have the

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opportunity to investigate the question of the number of business operated by Duke. Mr. Hebert questioned the need for him to attend a meeting when this issue might be investigated, stating that his point was this issue of the refrigerated trailer was new and not done under an existing business. The Board agreed that they would check with the Planning Board regarding the various businesses Mr. Winslow might have listed as "home businesses" when the community at large was requested to do so, and they further agreed that they would let Mr. Hebert know the outcome of this investigation.

Checks were signed, mail was reviewed and the meeting was adjourned at approximately 9:00 p.m.

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
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
