

MINUTES OF THE SELECTMEN'S MEETING - April 26, 1993

Present for the meeting which began at 7:00 p.m. were Selectmen Dodge, Johnston and Pimenta. Selectman Dodge took minutes of the meeting in the absence of Sandra Gendron who was working in the Town Clerk's Office.

Roger Gagnon, Meetinghouse Hill Road, was in to express his personal concern and the concern of some local business people with the enactment of mandatory recycling. He contended that insufficient notice had been given prior to the proposed implementation date of May 1st, and further contended that insufficient forethought had been given to the impact of mandatory recycling on the business community. He went on to state that people were going to have problems and would not know how to handle such issues as storage of material, provisions landlords should make for tenants, and the quality control of material that must be recycled from the prospective of dryness and cleanliness.

Ultimately, the Board of Selectmen maintained the enactment date of May 1st; however, agreed to schedule a meeting in the near future where any issues, especially those that might pertain specifically to the business community, might be addressed.


Fire Chief James Dodge was in to discuss further with the Board of Selectmen the issue of fire inspections. He stated that he had discussed the matter with Brad O'Neal a former fireman and inspector from Goffstown who was interested in the prospect of providing the necessary service, but not at this time. He did tell Jim he knew of someone else who might be interested and would contact to see if there was interest.

Discussion turned to the fact that David Poole, a resident of Howard Lane and a Building Inspector by trade with a background in fire protection, also a member of the New Boston Fire Department, is interested in providing the inspection service. Discussion revolved around concerns of the Selectmen, and those of the Fire Wards, with regard to David's ability to relate to the general public. There was agreement that David possessed the technical knowledge necessary, and that if David's expertise was utilized a probationary period would be employed. The need to explore funding for such inspections was discussed with no decision reached.

The Board reviewed a proposed agreement with the FDIC submitted by Planning Coordinator Claire Dane who has been working with an attorney from the FDIC with regard to completing the road work at Waldorf Estates known as Lincoln and Foxberry Drives. Selectman Johnston, currently representing the Board, on the Planning Board, would relay to the Planning Board that the Selectmen saw no issues with the proposed agreement. There was the question of unpaid taxes which would be discussed; however, subsequent to this meeting those unpaid taxes were received in full.

Mail was reviewed, checks were signed and the meeting was adjourned at approximately 10:00 p.m.
