Portsmouth because a contract that was not renewed in a timely fashion. The rate is going up in July, 2016, but it may be possible to put it off until January, 2017. It was hoped that if a five-year plan was not acceptable to Portsmouth, possibly a three-year or two year one might be. It was also noted that Greenland pays a much lower rate for their water from Portsmouth, and it has much further to travel than water from Portsmouth to New Castle. It was expected that New Castle would get an answer today, but it did not occur. The new water rate from Portsmouth is no longer a bargain. John Ireland asked if New Castle should direct their concerns to the Public Utilities Commission.
