

COMMISSION ON AGING April 19, 2010 DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL SERVICES REPORT

Applicants for Fuel Assistance have slowed down. Last day to apply for deliverable fuel was March 15th. We are taking the people who heat with electric or gas. We have completed 265 applications with 8 still pending. Last day to apply for fuel is May 3, 2010.

I have completed eight applications for fuel from Operation Fuel. At this date, I can only apply for electric with a shut off notice. Operation Fuels is a non profit and their funds are low this year.

This afternoon I had a person who had no food or money and had not called for any help. A family member came to visit from Maine because the gentleman was not answering the phone. I made an appointment for Social Security for tomorrow, State Medicaid application to help with food stamps, medical and some cash assistance. He does have the Sweet Hart Bus but no money to pay for each ride. I also completed a fuel assistance application as he heats with electric. He was a man who always worked and was embarrassed to ask for help.

We are still getting donations to keep food on our shelves in the pantry. I have about nineteen seniors and disabled who use the pantry each month.

We completed twenty-six ConnPace redetermination applications, sixteen Medicaid applications, and twenty-two QMB applications. The State of Ct increased the income for this program to \$1778.91 for a single person and \$2393.55 for accouple. QMB pays for the supplemental insurance with the state but the doctor has to be a state provider. QMB and SLMB pay for the part B \$96.40 that is deducted from Social Security checks each month. For 2010 the \$96.40 will remain the same. All applications require proof of income and assets.
