- 1. A complaint must be received by a member of the board in writing, identifying who the complaint is against, the nature of the complaint and signed by the person making the complaint.
- The complainant is notified in writing that the complaint has been received.
- 3. The respondent is notified in writing that the complaint has been received and is provided a copy of the complaint.

At this point the complaint is private and confidential as is the Boards investigation of the complaint.

- 4. The respondent may request that the investigation process be done in public. The respondent may request that the Board skips the investigation and moves right to a hearing.
- 5. If a hearing is not requested by the respondent the Board investigates the complaint to determine if it warrants a hearing.

Again, this investigation is private unless the respondent requests otherwise.

- 6. If the Board finds that a hearing is not warranted, the Board notifies the complainant and the respondent of its findings and the reason for its findings. If the Board finds that a hearing is warranted, the Board notifies the complainant and the respondent of its decision and sets a hearing date.
- 7. If the Board finds that a hearing is not warranted, the complaint, investigation and the finding remain confidential unless the respondent requests otherwise.
- 8. If there is a hearing, the respondent may be represented by an attorney, and is afforded the right to cross-examine any witness and to present testimony on his/her own behalf.
