THESE MINUTES ARE SUBJECT TO APPROVAL BY BOARD OF SELECTMEN

The Board of Selectmen held a regular meeting Monday, August 1, 2011 in the Council Chamber of the Municipal Center, Newtown. First Selectman Llodra called the meeting to order at 7:30pm.

PRESENT: First Selectman E. Patricia Llodra, Selectman William F.L. Rodgers, Selectman William F. Furrier

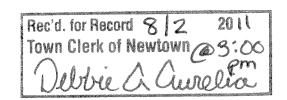
ALSO PRESENT: Finance Director Robert Tait, Capt. Joseph Carlone, Department of Corrections, one member of the public and two members of the press.

VOTER PARTICIPATION: Joseph Borst, 10 Beechwood Road said he doesn't understand why someone would bring suit against the town if they got injured at the fireman's carnival. The suit should be brought against the contractor of the carnival.

ACCEPTANCE OF THE MINUTES: Selectman Rodgers moved to accept the minutes of the regular meeting of July 5, 2011. First Selectman Llodra seconded. All in favor. Selectman Furrier moved to accept the minutes of the special meeting of July 13, 2011. Selectman Rodgers seconded. All in favor.

COMMUNICATIONS: First Selectman Llodra noted she received a letter from Canine Advocates of Newtown asking for consideration in dedicating the Animal Control Facility the Dr. Brian Silverleib Memorial Municipal Shelter in recognition of his years of support and promotion of great care of animals. Three letters were shared, the first from Dec. 22, 2010, from the Newtown Volunteer Ambulance Association to the Fairfield Hills Authority requesting a parcel of land on the corner of Keating Farms and Mile Hill South. The second letter is from Linda Manganaro, the new Executive Director of Nunnawauk Meadows, reflecting their interest in using a building or a piece of land in the Fairfield Hills campus for the extension of their facility in exchange for the 45 acres that they were granted by the State. The last letter is from Kevin's Community Center, a formal notification that they are regrettably not able to accept the grant because their financial analysis showed they would not be able to manage the financial responsibilities. Selectman Furrier shared a document with his concerns and questions relative to the recent amendment to the Fairfield Hills ordinance. He said the Fairfield Hills ordinance was achieved by a special act that had an expiration date associated with it. He outlined details for the town attorney to address and said that in the past the opinion of the town attorney has been final; he won't necessarily consider the opinion of the town attorney the final ruling. Selectman Rodgers said it is very common to amend ordinances pursuant to enabling legislation initially enacted by a time period. He also suggested Selectman Furrier go straight to the state with his concerns if he is not going to accept the town attorneys opinion even though the town is the client of the attorney. First Selectman Llodra said that as a Board of Selectmen we will be inviting Cohen & Wolf to respond to these eight points and develop an opinion related to each of them. We will accept the opinion as the opinion of our town attorney, as a Board of Selectmen. If there are additional inquires, the Board can pursue an additional inquiry; if the board does not feel there are additional inquires Selectman Furrier can pursue his concerns independent of the Board of Selectman.

FINANCE DIRECTOR REPORT: Mr. Tait reported East Haven is currently reviewing sales documents and waiting for state approval for the portables. The sales price is \$200,000 which will be applied to the debt service fund to offset future debt service. Mr. Tait noted that the transfers on the agenda reflect changing accounts within the budget. The idea is to be able to accurately track benefits; each department will have medical, social security, life insurance and long term disability.



ADD TO AGENDA: <u>Selectman Rodgers moved to add #17 under New Business, for discussion and possible action, the extension of the Fairfield Hills Broker Agreement.</u> Selectman Furrier seconded. All in favor.

Selectman Rodgers moved to add #18 under New Business, for discussion and possible action, the Dispatch Contract. Selectman Furrier seconded. All in favor.

Selectman Rodgers moved to add #19 under New Business, for discussion and possible action, the Animal Control Facility. Selectman Furrier seconded. All in favor.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Discussion and possible action:

1. Implementation Plan - Plan of Conservation and Development: item to be carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

Discussion and possible action:

- 1. Everbridge System: Captain Carlone presented the Everbridge System, which is an emergency notification system. The system allows specific areas to be notified. He suggests everybody sign up for CT Alerts. You can sign up to receive notification on your cell phone, your work phone, your home and where your kids go to school in the area. If you have a land line it is already part of the Everbridge System. There are different state agencies involved in Everbridge.
- 2. Appointments: Selectman Rodgers moved the re-appointment of Renate Adler, 198 Hattertown Road and Andrew Willie, 51 Butterfield Road, to the Fairfield Hills Authority for a term to expire 7/31/14. Selectman Furrier seconded. All in favor. Selectman Furrier moved the re-appointment of Bill McCarthy and Michelle Rosenthal to the Library Board of Trustees for a term to expire 7/1/14. Selectman Rodgers seconded. All in favor. First Selectman Llodra noted there are vacancies on the Design Review Board and Lake Lillinonah Authority and she expects to bring forward recommendations for appointments on September 6. There are also upcoming vacancies on the Pension Committee and the Economic Development Commission. There are ongoing vacancies on Sustainable Energy, Employee Benefits Committee and Hattertown Historic District.
- **3.** Tax Refunds: Selectman Rodgers moved the July Refunds #2 in the amount of \$3,951.74. Selectman Furrier seconded. All in favor.
- **4. Tax Refunds:** Selectman Furrier moved the August Refunds, #3 in the amount of \$4,885.41. Selectman Rodgers seconded. All in favor.
- **5. Driveway Bond Extension:** Selectman Rodgers moved to extend the driveway bond for Ray Corbo, 27 The Old Road, Lot 1B, Map 19, Block 6, Lot 8.1B for six months for an expiration date of January 31, 2012. Selectman Furrier seconded. All in favor.
- **6. Transfers:** Mr. Tait explained that the Human Resource expenses will be moved from the First Selectman's budget to a newly created Human Resource account. Pension (to pay TR Paul for pension checks) and miscellaneous benefits, such as pre-employment physicals is also moved to the Human Resource account. Selectman Furrier moved to transfer \$57,500 from 01100-1002 Secretary, Assistant to 01108-1001 Human Resource Administration; \$23,000 from 01260-2011 Services & Supplies to 01108-2011 Services and Supplies and \$18,500 from 01270-2006 Misc. Benefits to 01108-4060 Fees & Professional Services. Selectman Rodgers seconded. All in favor.
- 7. **Transfer:** The Police are taking over the administration of the security contract at Fairfield Hills. Selectman Rodgers moved the transfer of \$85,037 from 01870-4060 Contractual Services to 01310-4060. Selectman Furrier seconded. All in favor.
- **8. Outside Organization Transfers:** Outside agencies have been put into one department. <u>Selectman Furrier moved</u> the transfers as reflected in Att. A. Selectman Rodgers seconded. All in favor.

- 9. Long Term Disability Transfers: Long Term Disability is being transferred from one account into each department. Selectman Rodgers moved \$30,000 in transfers as reflected in Att. B. Selectman Furrier seconded. All in favor.
- **10. Life Insurance Transfers:** Life Insurance is being transferred from employee benefits to the various departments. Selectman Furrier moved to transfer \$45,000 in transfers as reflected in Att. C. Selectman Rodgers seconded. All in favor.
- **11. FICA Transfers:** FICA is being transferred from one account to be distributed to the various departments. Selectman Rodgers moved to transfer \$817,005 in transfers as reflected in Att. D. Selectman Furrier seconded. All in favor.
- **12. Pension Transfers:** This transfers the pension from three accounts to the various department accounts. Selectman Furrier moved the transfers as reflected in Att. E. Selectman Rodgers seconded. All in favor.
- 13. Medical Benefits Transfers: Medical Benefits is being taken from one account to the various departments. Selectman Rodgers moved to transfer \$2,806,855 in transfers as reflected in Att. F. Selectman Furrier seconded. All in favor. First Selectman Llodra said it is important to educate people on these changes because it will appear that we have increased funding for departments. Mr. Tait said he will have a benefits summary sheet at budget time with last years and this years information that will tie in to the departments. Selectman Rodgers thinks this is a good switch if it helps people look at the various departments with a better overall understanding of the total cost. Selectman Furrier thinks it will be well received.
- 14. Department of Homeland Security Resolution: Selectman Rodgers moved to resolve that the First Selectman may enter into with and deliver to the State of Connecticut Department of Emergency Management and Homeland Security any and all documents which it deems to be necessary or appropriate; and further resolved that E. Patricia Llodra, as the First Selectman of the Town of Newtown, is authorized and directed to execute and deliver any and all documents on behalf of the Board of Selectman and to do and perform all acts and things which he/she deems to be necessary or appropriate to carry out the terms of such documents, including, but not limited to, executing and delivering all agreements and documents contemplated by such documents. Selectman Furrier seconded. All in fayor.
- 15. Resolution: Selectman Rodgers moved the resolution: RESOLUTION AMENDING A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR A SPECIAL APPROPRIATION IN THE AMOUNT OF \$4,257,690 FOR ROOF REPLACEMENT AT NEWTOWN MIDDLE SCHOOL AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$4,257,690 BONDS OF THE TOWN TO MEET SAID APPROPRIATION AND PENDING THE ISSUANCE THEREOF THE MAKING OF TEMPORARY BORROWINGS FOR SUCH PURPOSE and waived the reading of the entire resolution(Att. G). Selectman Furrier seconded. Selectman Rodgers noted the amount is not being increased but the scope of things for which contingency can be used is being increased. First Selectman Llodra said that the amount authorized to spend is \$4,257,690 however, the plan is to spend less because of the debt cap.
- 16. Fund Balance Policy First Draft: First Selectman Llodra noted that the current policy calls for an unreserved fund balance of not less than 5% and no more than 16%; this is too broad. The guidelines in the draft ask to consider the number of the unrestricted fund balance be no less than 8% and no more than 12%. Currently excess in fund balance is to be used for capital projects and other onetime uses; this is non-specific. Suggestions for excess of 12% are to transfer to the debt service fund, to use it for the capital non-recurring fund or used to reduce the tax rate. The current policy puts the responsibility on the finance director to recommend a process to restore the fund balance up to the minimum amount should it fall below the percent called for by the policy. The draft puts that responsibility on the Board of Finance. The draft includes language to expand the policy statement. The board will talk through it and make changes before forwarding to the Board of Finance.
- 17. Fairfield Hills Broker Agreement: First Selectman Llodra reported that in May 2011 the board extended the broker agreement to the end of July. The Fairfield Hills Authority does not want to make any changes in the current arrangement until the review process is complete but does want to extend the agreement so they are not without representation. Selectman Rodgers moved to extend the term of the

listing agreement regarding the Fairfield Hills properties through October 31, 2011. Selectman Furrier seconded. Selectman Rodgers asked about interest in the property. First Selectman Llodra said interest is constant. All in favor.

- 18. Dispatch Contract: Selectman Rodgers moved to authorize the First Selectman to ratify the contract with the dispatcher/clerical union. Selectman Furrier seconded. All in favor. The total salary cost to offset the contract is reflected in the following transfer: Selectman Rodgers moved to transfer \$20,445 from 01570-2000 Contingency to \$18,992 01300-1001 Full Time Operators and \$1,453 01300-2002 FICA. Selectman Furrier seconded. All in favor.
- 19. Animal Control Facility: The ground breaking for the Animal Control Facility will be held on August 10 at 9:00am. First Selectman Llodra said the a plaque recognizing the efforts of Dr. Silverleib is something that would communicate to the community that we recognize and value his commitment over a long period of time. Selectman Furrier said Dr. Silverleib is an individual that resonates very strongly with the community; this is a very nice gesture. Selectman Rodgers said knew Dr. Silverleib as a wonderful person and is fully in support of this. First Selectman said a brass plaque installed on a rock or a tree at the entryway of the facility would express our gratitude and appreciation for his efforts to help this become a reality.

VOTER COMMENTS: none.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Selectman Rodgers moved to enter executive session to discuss legal matters — fall at fireman's carnival; Zoning violations 1 Stone Bridge Trail and Personnel Matters, Cultural Arts. Selectman Furrier seconded. All in favor. Executive session was entered into at 8:48pm and returned to regular session at 9:00pm with the following motions:

Selectman Rodgers moved to authorize the Town Attorney to defend the Fire Marshal in a suit brought forward relative to a fall at the fireman's carnival. Selectman Furrier seconded. All in favor.

Selectman Furrier moved to authorize the Zoning Enforcement Officer to pursue legal action against the property owners at 1 Stone Bridge Trail. Selectman Rodgers seconded. All in favor.

No motion was taken relative to personnel matters, Cultural Arts.

ANNOUNCEMENTS: none.

ADJOURNMENT: Having no further business the Board of Selectmen adjourned their regular meeting at 8:47pm.

RESOLUTION AMENDING A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR A SPECIAL APPROPRIATION IN THE AMOUNT OF \$4,257,690 FOR ROOF REPLACEMENT AT NEWTOWN MIDDLE SCHOOL AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$4,257,690 BONDS OF THE TOWN TO MEET SAID APPROPRIATION AND PENDING THE ISSUANCE THEREOF THE MAKING OF TEMPORARY BORROWINGS FOR SUCH PURPOSE

RESOLVED:

Section 1. Section 1 of the resolution entitled "Resolution Providing For A Special Appropriation In The Amount Of \$4,257,690 For Roof Replacement At Newtown Middle School And Authorizing The Issuance Of \$4,257,690 Bonds Of The Town To Meet Said Appropriation And Pending The Issuance Thereof The Making Of Temporary Borrowings For Such Purpose," approved at a Special Town Meeting held June 28, 2010, (the 'Resolution') is hereby amended to expand the scope of the project to include replacement and/or extension of the HVAC and related electrical and architectural and work, related to the cafeteria, nurse/administrative office and computer rooms thereby making said Section read as follows:

'Section 1. The sum of \$4,257,690 is a special appropriation made pursuant to Chapter 6, Section 6-30 (a), (b) and (c) of the Town Charter of the Town of Newtown for the design and construction of the roof replacement at Newtown Middle School as authorized in the capital improvement program for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011, including replacement and/or extension of the HVAC and related electrical and architectural work, and replacement of the skylights, electrical, duct, and ceiling, all related to the cafeteria, nurse/administrative office and computer rooms, and for administrative, financing, legal and costs of issuance related thereto (collectively, the 'Project'), said appropriation to be inclusive of any and all State and Federal grants-in-aid thereof.'

Section 2. Section 5 of the Resolution shall be applicable to the amendment made hereunder, as of the date of the adoption of this resolution.
